### Hi everyone,

Wanted to let you know where we are on the Northwood Family Communication Strategy.

- We are working with a total of 35 callers and have assigned 8 of them as COVID callers (calling family members of residents positive for COVID). In the chart below, the yellow are COVID callers and the green are those assigned non-COVID calls. You'll see not everyone has call assignments yet. We have started (generally) with an assignment of 10 families/residents for each caller.
- The change for us to make COVID calls is based on Northwood's need for support as the numbers have expanded. They have a handful of people making hundreds of calls (including only two nurses making COVID calls on a daily basis).

#### Non-COVID callers

- o Were given their lists early this morning and will start making calls today.
- o Will make calls once or twice a week (more if family requests) during regular business hours. After hours/weekend calls needed by the family for this group will be addressed by NW.
- o Time commitment is likely an average one hour a day (if they made the calls all in one day, assuming an assignment of approx. 10).

#### COVID callers

- o Will be getting their assignments shortly and also start making calls today.
- They have been given read-only access to NW's electronic chart (PointClickCare) to have most recent information available before calling the family member/next of kin.
- o They have been directed to document the calls in SEAscape; at a future time, we will have them print/create a report of the notes and send to NW. (NW doesn't need them daily or regularly. They will chart them later.)
- o This group of callers will likely be required to make calls on weekends. (If family indicates they don't need the calls on the weekends, they won't need to.) We have indicated to them to work with their manager on how their time will be managed/covered.
- o Time commitment will be greater as these are daily calls but NW tells us they tend to be pretty quick calls. As with many of our client families, I'm sure the conversations and needs vary. So perhaps an hour a day.
- For both groups of callers, you'll want to stay connected on how much time this is taking them and the impact to their regular caseload.

• I've heard from a couple of you that additional staff have come forward. As you can see, I think we'll be okay for a while. As numbers shift at NW, our call assignments will also shift but I think we'll be fine with the number of people we have. The COVID calls need to be made by RNs which is why we've tracked that.

I have attached the documents I've shared with the callers, FYI. We had an orientation session with all callers yesterday afternoon and another this morning for just the COVID callers. Robin is supporting the coordination and dissemination of daily updates from NW and the balance of call assignments. Thank you for your emails dated April 17 and 19. Northwood, as you acknowledge, is experiencing a healthcare emergency as a result of the COVID-19. With both residents and staff impacted, Northwood's resources have been stretched to manage a growing situation, but we can tell you that a number of supports are now in effect.

As a longstanding provider of senior's care, Northwood is caring for our most vulnerable population and all healthcare partners recognize the importance of their work. As a result of this situation the healthcare community has rallied around them to support the residents and staff through this difficult time.

Effective April 17, Nova Scotia Health Authority (NSHA) and the Department of Health and Wellness are onsite to support Northwood's emergency plan. Staff from the Halifax Infirmary COVID-19 unit have been redeployed to Northwood to assist treating COVID-19 positive residents and a COVID-19 Recovery Unit has been established at a local hotel to care for recovered residents. Onsite testing is also underway.

You aren't listening to the front line staff. Management for some reason wants you to believe they have everything under control. Those working understaffed and without necessary equipment would disagree.

I have a family member who works as an LPN daily with fewer than necessary staff to care for the general population. She starts with a full compliment and before the day starts she is required to send staff to Covid-19 floors. Her residents can't get showers on a regular basis. Bare minimum is being done for them. When asked about temperatures she reported she had no working thermometer. Only when she said it was time to talk to the media did someone find them one thermometer with one package of probes.

For the record, some group came in to donate masks and face shields. The office staff is

wearing the face shields. LPN's and personal care workers are not getting that equipment.

Today they sent home potential staff because no one had time to do an orientation. They wouldn't allow them to stay and do basic stuff like hydration.

Management is completely out of touch with the realities on the floors and yet they are reporting everything is fine.

Someone needs to go in and see what is really happening not take Josie Ryan or Janet Simms at their word.

It is critical. The staff that are there won't last much longer. They are physically and emotionally drained at the end of each shift.

Do something!

### Hi Colin, Vickie

Sharing some information from one of my team members deployed to Northwood to provide resident care. Things certainly are improving, but these concerns confirm for me we need a mechanism in place with DHW to identify resident care and safety and staff support and safety in homes with outbreaks and an ongoing monitoring mechanism. I continue to raise this at various DHW tables. We also sent this as a request to DHW through our EOC but their response did not address our request. I requested our EOC resubmit our request to DHW, not sure if that happened. This feedback was from last week. Hearing again today on the call staffing is falling at times below critical levels. Very concerning. Appreciate your thoughts and advice.

Just spoke with one of our employees who continues on-site at NW. She relayed that availability of PPE is much better than it had been though access to sinks is still troublesome (likely due to age of building / design).

She reported that staffing continues to be a challenge as the residents are "so sick and care is so much more now so 3 CCAs in evening for 30 residents. Some nights, none of the CCAs know them." She has been helping them as she is getting to know residents well. Also reported that she is working on a unit (6 Centre) where there are 23 positive residents, while 6 are reportedly negative. Many positive rsome esidents wandering about and sharing a room with residents who are +ve. Some negative residents also wander about. Understandably, she worries about spread of the virus. Care is reportedly getting heavier as residents are more unwell. Reportedly three CCAs on in morning from 7-8:30 to get all residents cleaned up and ready for breakfast for 8:30 breakfast time. Reporting residents "likely haven't had a bath in a week as their hair is all greasy". "They are often wet but do get changed". Most residents in bed and

unable to help themselves. Also reports significant delays in pick-up of dirty laundry and emptying of garbage. Reportedly garbage cans are overflowing and at one point yesterday, there were no bed pans or fitted sheets available on the unit. She was also concerned about lack of communication about what is going on the floor (e.g. Reporting deaths of residents – a resident passed shortly after she left one evening and didn't learn until end of shift the next day that he had in fact passed and never did make to an isolation room to see his one family member before passing.). Sensing a lack of "direct patient staff support".

#### Hi Brendan

No problem at all. There are two parts to the Northwood situation. Their staffing situation is extremely challenging today and over the weekend. Wendy, my director just gave me an update. They now have 71 positive residents. Several are near the end of their lives. It is very sad. DHW had a call with them earlier today to explore EHS deployment. DHW didn't include us but did reach out afterwards - we are confirming with NW and DHW if there is anything we need to do today to support Northwood. We put a call out across all zones yesterday for RNs, LPNs and CCAs. DHW put a call out last evening to NHs and HC agencies across the province.

The second part of their story is the proposed relocation of 5-10 recovered residents to an alternate site. Janet originally proposed Inn on the Lake but yesterday proposed the Lord Nelson. DHW is leading this work with them as it is really with government inspectors (licensing, environment, public health, fire marshal) to determine a safe location. They met with NW staff at the Lord Nelson Hotel this morning but determined it was not an appropriate care setting. They are trying to organize similar inspections of the Westin, Best Western and Holiday Inn for this afternoon. I have given Madonna and Vickie a heads up that we may get an ask later today or tomorrow about using space at the Rehab Centre. I am doubtful, but hope to be proven wrong, that they will find a

hotel safe for the delivery of nursing home level care. They had hoped to begin relocating 3 residents on Monday. We have offered any assistance we can in this effort. Please reiterate this with Janet.







Thank you so much for your support of the Northwood at this difficult time. I'm not the MOH that follows this facility regularly, so while I don't have full details, I do know that the testing strategy has been aggressive, and if applicable, iterative, with repeated testing of residents. Typically, if there is a single case on a unit the entire unit is then swabbed. There is also swabbing based on the units where positive staff have worked while infectious (included up to 2 days before symptom onset). The director of the facility could certainly provide more specific details. As Wendy mentioned, there is a meeting tomorrow with the lead MOH supporting this facility, myself and Dr. Strang. The ongoing testing strategy will be one of the topics covered. Wendy – perhaps I could have Dr. Daniela Kempkens connect back to you tomorrow? She will be the MOH on-call and also has been following this outbreak.



Yes. In addition to the virtual physician back-up the needs are for:

1. Collecting vital signs on the COVID-19 +ve residents, now spread out over 4 floors at Northwood. Talking to Barry tonight he is expecting upwards of 70 cases. Today he was able to get bid vital signs on only 17 of his 40 patients. Inasmuch as this can mostly be automated (oximeter, electronic thermometer, BP machine when heart rate high) this can be done by anyone trained in how to use the machinery - some clinical research personnel (eg psychometrists, kinesiologists) might fill that gap.

- 2. IPAC support for ongoing monitoring.

#### **KEY MESSAGES**

- Our priority is the safety of residents and staff.
- As you know, Northwood has an outbreak of COVID-19 impacting many residents and staff.
   Sadly, several residents have died from COVID-19.
- Northwood is following direction and advice from Public Health related to the care provided to
  those affected and is working with Nova Scotia Health Authority and the Department of
  Health and Wellness to ensure there is sufficient staff to care for residents and manage
  operations. The NSHA COVID clinical team as well as our Family Practice and Geriatrics
  physicians are working closely with the Northwood clinical team.
- We are committed to keeping staff, residents and families informed about all developments related to COVID-19 and how we will continue to ensure everyone receives the care they need.

## **Phone Script:**

Good afternoon / morning.

My name is [first name]. I am a XXXX with NSHA. I am calling to speak with [name of family member / substitute decision maker].

You may be aware that the Nova Scotia Health Authority is working very closely with Northwood. I'm calling to give you an update on how (name of resident) is doing. ## **DRAFT Questions & Answers for Northwood Family Communication**

#### How did COVID-19 get into Northwood?

While we can't say for certain, we expect it may have been brought into the facility by employees who were not exhibiting symptoms of the virus.

We unfortunately had a number of staff working in our Halifax facility who had not travelled and were either symptom free or mild symptoms not known to be associated with infection of the virus. They exhibited none of the tell-tale signs and continued to work. These individuals may have been exposed in their homes and communities. They were not aware of the fact that they were spreading the virus and they are devastated by this. It reinforces the critical nature of the Public Health orders. The choices that we make in our home and our communities may impact us all, including the vulnerable individuals living at Northwood's Halifax Campus.

# Why is my loved one in the same room/on the same floor with someone who is positive? Are individuals who are COVID-19 positive residents being isolated?

Measures have been put in place to separate residents and limit contact within the overall capacity and layout of the facility.

In the planning and preparation for COVID-19, Northwood prepared a 20-unit, single room unit. With increasing numbers on other floors, a second COVID-19 unit was created with an additional 23 beds. With additional spread throughout the building, we are now isolating individuals within their rooms on their units at this time. Measures have been put in place to separate residents and limit contact within the overall capacity and layout of the facility. A treatment unit has been created for residents with COVID-19.

Unfortunately, given the spread and experience with testing if an individual who has not been tested is sharing a room with a COVID positive resident we have to assume that co-resident is positive unit testing can confirm their status. We then determine the ability to separate within our capacity.

#### Can I come and get my parent/loved one and bring them home with me?

Family members are permitted to remove their loved ones under certain conditions, but it is not recommended. Please contact Linda Verlinden to discuss.

#### If my loved one becomes ill with COVID-19 will I be able to see them?

Unfortunately, we are not able to allow visitors at this time. Exceptions may be made for compassionate reasons. Needs to be confirmed. Until confirmed, direct specific requests to Linda Verlinden.

#### How will I know if my loved one gets COVID-19?

Someone from Northwood will contact you to discuss your loved one's test results and care plan.

#### What are you doing to make sure there are enough staff to look after my loved one?

Northwood's resources have been stretched to manage a growing situation, but we can tell you that a number of supports are now in effect. Northwood has received support from a number of organizations including NSHA, EHS, VON and the Red Cross to ensure there is sufficient staff to care for residents and manage operations.

#### What are you doing to screen staff to make sure they are heathy before they come to work?

We are screening all staff when they arrive at the facility, which includes temperature checks at least once daily and if they start to have symptoms in the workplace, they go home immediately. We have a detailed script of screen questions that are updated when needed. Staff who have any signs or symptoms of illness are required to stay home and call occupational health prior to coming to work.

#### What are you doing to screen residents to make sure they don't have COVID-19?

We are closely monitoring all residents. This includes daily assessment for symptoms and temperature checks to identify any resident with COVID-19 symptoms and we provide testing if any symptoms are identified.

#### How will you prevent my parent/ loved one from catching COVID-19?

We have implemented strict isolation measures to protect residents. We are following guidelines provided by Public Health and Nova Scotia Health Authority. Good hand and respiratory hygiene, regular health screening of staff and residents, social distancing, and rigorous environmental disinfection are all key measures. All staff are issued and have received training on the appropriate use of PPE.

#### Are residents being moved into hotels?

A COVID-19 Recovery Unit has been set up at the Holiday Inn where residents who have recovered from COVID-19 are being moved to a local hotel that meets health and safety requirements.

#### Will COVID-19 positive residents be transferred to hospital?

The COVID-19 unit at the Halifax Infirmary has been relocated to Northwood to help support the acute care needs of residents on site. Northwood's Medical Director is working with a team of physicians to assess residents and determine the best environment for treatment. We are able to complete testing and treatment for COVID-19 onsite.

#### What are you doing to ensure the safety of residents?

Northwood has implemented isolation measures to protect residents. All employees are screened on entry and self-screening symptoms of illness every day, and we are continually monitoring and testing residents. Care providers are equipped with the necessary personal protective equipment (PPE) Increased infection control measures are in place to help mitigate the spread of the disease. We are continually reviewing processes to determine if more can be done. Employees are also trained in exceptional hand hygiene and health habits as they support those in our care.

#### Do employees have access to personal protective equipment (PPE)?

All of our staff have the personal protective equipment (PPE) they need to support our residents.

#### Why is Northwood's Halifax Long Term Care Facility been hit so hard by the COVID-19 virus?

We have a team working with public health analyzing the data. We're hoping that the data will give us information about how we got here and how we respond going forward. The long term care industry is used to communal living and we have expertise in preventing infections and outbreaks. This is part of what we do every day however the characteristic and behavior of this virus has never been seen.

## **Instructions for calling families of non-COVID residents:**

- You will be given the full resident master list that includes all caller assignments. From this list, you will be able to tell if there are COVID-positive people on the unit(s) of residents you have been assigned (these are the highlighted names).
  - o The next of kin listed is their first "emergency contact" on record.
  - o If you need help with the list, contact Robin.Latta@nshealth.ca
- Make calls at least once a week, unless family requests more frequent or you identify need for more frequent contact. Be sensitive to family members who you feel may benefit from more frequent contact. Offer to call twice a week. Recognize that you may not have new information but the reassurance of a call may be helpful for some.
  - o Calls should be able to be kept to Monday-Friday during regular business hours.
  - Provide the family member your contact information but be sure to include information on what hours you will be available to receive and make calls.
  - o If a family requests contact beyond these hours, inform Linda Verlinden that such contact has been requested.
- Use the script provided, adjusting wording as necessary based on your judgment but keeping to the key messages.
- The Q&As can be used to inform and support your responses to questions that come up.
  - Common questions are about having COVID and non-COVID people on same floor (or in same room). Be familiar with that response.
- If the family member asks specifics about the care or health status of their loved one, give them the name and phone number of the appropriate Northwood staff member as noted below. You can be clear that you do not have access to their chart.
  - Social Workers for clinical and resident-specific care questions (e.g. if family wants to take them home, care tasks performed, etc.)

  - Nursing contact information available separately on NW Nursing Quick List
- First thing every morning, you will receive an email from Robin Latta with an updated master list which will include new COVID-positive cases and other do not call residents/families.
  - o You will need to review the names of your resident list each day before making calls.

- Do not call families of people on your list who are newly COVID-positive. They will be contacted by someone else who has access to the resident's chart.
- The morning email will also include a do not call list for other reasons (e.g. palliative, went home with family, etc.).
- Throughout the day, you may receive an additional email(s) from Robin if someone on your list has tested positive for COVID-19. <u>Do not call</u> these families.
- Someone else (Northwood staff or volunteer) will likely have already made calls to the family. Keep
  this in mind. There may also be cases where they have had recent contact based on a call they made
  to the unit or someone else at Northwood. We won't always be able to identify when multiple calls
  will be made.
- At the end of each day, document the calls in the communication log through this survey link: Northwood Family Contact Tracking
  - o Includes: date, name, resident group, number of calls, outstanding issues.
  - These will be reviewed on a daily basis and information reported as necessary.
  - Additional documentation of the non-COVID calls is not required.
  - Only add issues that you were not able to address or did not refer directly to Northwood.
     This will avoid duplication of effort.
  - O Do not include identifying information (resident or family) in the survey. We will contact you directly if there is a specific issue that needs follow up.
- Access to Northwood's electronic health record (PointClickCare) is not required.
- Messages about the resident being non-COVID positive should be provided in the context that this is
  the information you have at the time. If their loved one subsequently tests positive, they will be
  contacted directly by someone else (from Northwood).
- Northwood is providing virtual connections for families to talk with their loved one. Have the family call 902-719-7523 to leave their name and number and then Northwood staff will call them back.

When staff who have been brought in from another facility to support an outbreak go back to their home organization, ideally they would be off work for 14 days of self-isolation. It is recognized that this is extremely challenging, and is creating a barrier to getting assistance from staff in other areas of the health system. Therefore, staff can continue to come to work under the following guidelines:

- Screening and temperature checks at least twice during shift
- Wearing a mask while at work
- Close adherence to hand hygiene
- Staff who become unwell, will be put off work right away.

When at home, these staff should monitor themselves carefully, stay at home as much as they can, and minimize trips outside the home. This directive applies to all staff including VON, NSHA, and HRCE who have been redeployed to a LTC facility.



#### Hi Kitty,

Just spoke with Shawna who is at Northwood with Breagh & Josh. They have come up with a plan to help make things a little safer and more efficient. This plan was mainly developed with input from the staff working on both the 1<sup>st</sup> & 11<sup>th</sup> floor. Trish Bilski is also available to the staff should they have any questions about enacting the residents plan of care.

Two units set up

- ? 11<sup>th</sup> floor with a capacity of 16 and an occupancy of 12 (all single rooms with positive and presumptive cases)
- ? 1<sup>st</sup> floor with a capacity of 22-23 beds and it is full. Residents are in single, double and triple room accommodations.

They had a rough start to the morning as

- ? No have access to patient information that would be needed to provide safe care i.e. swallowing difficulties, mobility difficulties, code status, medication, allergies, etc.
- ? No access to NSHA policies/procedures, the COVID Hub, or Northwood policies/procedures i.e. code blue protocol, location of AED, etc.
- ? No form of orientation to the place or the residents
- ? One unit had an OTA and two CTA assigned, the other unit had Licensed staff assigned.
- ? IPAC practices of significant concern for both residents and staff

Plan developed by Josh (HSM NSHA), Breagh (CNE), Shawna (PPL) Patsy & IPAC team

- ? Patsy & IPAC team working with Northwood staff to review PPE best practices
- ? Getting process in place to ensure staff have access to the COVID hub for reference and information
- ? Setting up charting process Northwood staff will print off patient plan of care, NSHA nurses will doc on progress notes and will have access to a physician order form if necessary
- Shawna with Northwood managers/CNE reviewing code blue process. Once confirmed will review with NSHA staff. Anticipating our code blue pathway for suspect/known case if AED available.
- ? Patsy going to provide IPAC signage for two units (? Possibly more areas) as reminders for staff
- ? The nursing care approach will be team/task based nursing i.e one med nurse and other team members working together to provide care needed. As much as possible, Med nurse will remain "clean" and patient care teams will try not to cross resident assignments.
- ? Seeking approval to have Residents wear name band until NSHA nurses become more familiar with who they are and know what is needed to confirm identify
- ? IPPL will provide one more CNE to help set-up units.
- ? IPPL team will work with Joanne, CNE from Northwood to plan a unit orientation that can be provided to staff coming to the facility for the first time.



#### Hi Kitty,

Just spoke with Shawna who is at Northwood with Breagh & Josh. They have come up with a plan to help make things a little safer and more efficient. This plan was mainly developed with input from the staff working on both the 1<sup>st</sup> & 11<sup>th</sup> floor. Trish Bilski is also available to the staff should they have any questions about enacting the residents plan of care.

Two units set up

- ? 11<sup>th</sup> floor with a capacity of 16 and an occupancy of 12 (all single rooms with positive and presumptive cases)
- ? 1<sup>st</sup> floor with a capacity of 22-23 beds and it is full. Residents are in single, double and triple room accommodations.

They had a rough start to the morning as

- ? No have access to patient information that would be needed to provide safe care i.e. swallowing difficulties, mobility difficulties, code status, medication, allergies, etc.
- ? No access to NSHA policies/procedures, the COVID Hub, or Northwood policies/procedures i.e. code blue protocol, location of AED, etc.
- ? No form of orientation to the place or the residents
- ? One unit had an OTA and two CTA assigned, the other unit had Licensed staff assigned.
- ? IPAC practices of significant concern for both residents and staff

Plan developed by Josh (HSM NSHA), Breagh (CNE), Shawna (PPL) Patsy & IPAC team

- ? Patsy & IPAC team working with Northwood staff to review PPE best practices
- ? Getting process in place to ensure staff have access to the COVID hub for reference and information
- ? Setting up charting process Northwood staff will print off patient plan of care, NSHA nurses will doc on progress notes and will have access to a physician order form if necessary
- ? Shawna with Northwood managers/CNE reviewing code blue process. Once confirmed will review with NSHA staff. Anticipating our code blue pathway for suspect/known case if AED available.
- ? Patsy going to provide IPAC signage for two units (? Possibly more areas) as reminders for staff
- ? The nursing care approach will be team/task based nursing i.e one med nurse and other team members working together to provide care needed. As much as possible, Med nurse will remain "clean" and patient care teams will try not to cross resident assignments.
- ? Seeking approval to have Residents wear name band until NSHA nurses become more familiar with who they are and know what is needed to confirm identify
- ? IPPL will provide one more CNE to help set-up units.
- ? IPPL team will work with Joanne, CNE from Northwood to plan a unit orientation that can be provided to staff coming to the facility for the first time.





I have provided you the packing of what they are being provided, this product is from China. There is no information on the packaging to tell then what is the level of the protection of the mask. I have also included a picture of the box of the products that are supplied at NSHA. I thought they were being provided the same protection. This is very concerning to me, especially for the nurses working on 1 Center, the dementia unit, where the patients are roaming. I would have thought if NW could not

# provide the level of protection to our nurses that they obtained at NSHA, then NSHA would have provided the appropriate masks fro them.

They were also dropped off N95 masks, also produced in China. They have holes in the masks, and they will be insuring that no one wears them. For one they would have to be fit tested again, these are from Wuhan and not the type of N95 provided by NSHA. Those N95 masks at NSHA, there are two types of N95, the duck bill and the come. However, these look like very poor quality, as they took a picture wearing one with a surgical mask underneath and it was still gapping on the side.

The nurses are requesting that they be provided with the information of the level of protection of the mask that is being provided. They would like to see some literature as well about these masks, as they are concerned and how many microns is each mask and the quality of the mask itself. For example are they 80,120 or 160 microns, I will assume they are not 120 and certainly not 160.

I look forward to hearing from you and I will be forwarding my email of the nurses' concerns to NSGEU.



I am writing in follow-up to the questions about the masks at Northwood plus other questions about NSHA masks and FIT testing. The following people were consulted to respond to these questions: Patsy Rawding, Manager for Infection Control, Procurement at Northwood, Evan Cheung, Director of Supply Chain Operations, and Angela Keenan, Manager Occupational Health Safety & Wellness.

- Procedural/Surgical masks the minimum standard for droplet protection is 60 mm Hg
  (this measures fluid resistance see definition below). There are several different masks
  in circulation right now and Infection Control has worked with procurement to ensure all
  makes and models of surgical masks being brought in meet or exceed the required
  standards.
- Regarding procedural/surgical masks, NSHA has received and distributed several different models from several different suppliers. Most of what is currently being distributed is from our usual supplier PriMED. Some models are not the same as the ones that we typically use. Some of the federal shipments that have arrived are also PriMED masks. All procedural/surgical masks distributed meet or exceed ASTM Level 1 standards (they are a minimum of 80 mm Hg or higher).
- Regarding procedural/surgical masks at Northwood, Northwood also has several types
  of procedural/surgical masks in use. Some of the masks do not show the fluid
  resistance level on the box itself. Patsy reviewed all types of procedural/surgical masks
  at Northwood with their procurement and then, connected with Aaron Munro in our
  NSHA procurement as the NSHA has also purchased the same brands of masks and had
  reviewed the technical information to ensure they met the standard. All masks being
  used by Northwood meet the ASTM standard or the European equivalent EN 14683. All

- were found to be 80mm Hg or above. These are also being used at the NSHA as well. Northwood also received a shipment of masks form the federal supply.
- Most masks do come from China and/or parts of them come from China and they may be assembled in a different country. A Staff Masking FAQ has been attached, please refer to question 9 which speaks to why some masks may look different than others.
- Additional disposable gowns have been supplied to Northwood from the DHW stockpile.
- N95 masks are not required by staff at Northwood as they are and will not be performing Aerosol Generating Medical Procedures.
- All 3M N95 masks used by NSHA meet NIOSH N95 standards. So does the Harley L-188.
   Both are listed as approved respirators on the CDC site.

- 3M N95 masks currently in circulation within NSHA include: models 1860, 1860s, 1870, 1870+ & 8210. We did receive a shipment of Chinese N95 masks (Harley L-188) but we have not yet FIT tested staff to this model. OHSW continues to work with Procurement and the Provincial PPE Working Group to identify suitable N95's to ensure that staff have the right PPE, for the right job, at the right time. A FAQ regarding the FIT testing strategy has been attached to this email.

Josh is available to respond to any questions and can review this information with staff tomorrow. We will also be requesting that the information about the various masks be shared again in the next COVID 19 update so other staff who see unfamiliar supplies have this information as well.

**Fluid Resistance:** Fluid resistance reflects the surgical mask's ability to minimize the amount of fluid that could transfer from the outer layers through to the inner layer as the result of a splash or spray. ASTM specifies testing with synthetic blood at pressures of 80, 120, or 160 mm Hg to qualify for low, medium, or high fluid resistance. These pressures correlate to blood pressure: 80 mm Hg = venous pressure (Level 1), 120 mm Hg = arterial pressure (Level 2), and 160 mm Hg (Level 3) correlates to potential high pressures that may occur during trauma, or surgeries that include high pressure irrigation such as orthopedic procedures.


Hi Alex & Lewis



DHW has reflected that we should revisit our planning assumptions and discuss any shifts or add-ons to the LTC clinical pathways. - Reflection questions/discussion:
  - Quality/Clinical Pathways. Our planning assumption that we will face an surge in hospitals may need to be revisited as we flatten the curve and observe low volumes/occupancy in hospitals. It also appears that this wave of the pandemic will impact LTC more than hospital settings. What is the appropriate

- approach to caring for (COVID19) residents in LTC? Is our transfer policy still appropriate?
- Sustainability/Capacity. NSHA is leading/supporting on 8 LTC outbreaks.
   What is NSHA's capacity should this increase? How might we improve the sustainability of our collective approach?
- Integration/Whole System Approach. We have effectively converted Northwood into a hospital annex. Is this approach suitable elsewhere (other zones)? Should we be looking at identifying other locations to "hospitalizing LTC" and hotels for recovered patients? Previously we discussed converting RCF to LTC, given the current approach is this still recommended?

Please see our responses below.

In the initial 24 hours of relocating staff from 8.4 to Northwood (NW), in accordance with the Ministerial Directive, there has been a tremendous amount of work accomplished. NSHA employees are currently providing care to residents on two units as follows:

- 11 Manor; 11<sup>th</sup> floor unit with a capacity of 16 and an occupancy of 12
- 1 Centre; 1<sup>st</sup> floor unit with a capacity of 22-23 beds and is fully occupied

In an effort to provide you with an overview of actions taken to date, we can summarize as follows:

## Staffing/Management/HR:

- Health Services Manager is on site and has shared his contact information with employees if needed during evenings and/or overnight
- Both units have Charge Nurse assigned, based on a long week/short week rotation and work will continue around defining roles on the unit. There will not be an additional short

- assignment added.
- Additional support is available from the NW Facility Supervisor, IPAC, Professional Practice, etc
- The unit aide from 8.4 has been relocated to NW and clerical support will be there as of tomorrow
- There is space available for staff to enjoy rest breaks
- NW has offered accommodations and meals
- Getting process in place to ensure staff have access to the COVID hub for reference and information
- Setting up charting process, interim measures have been put in place while we arrange for access to electronic system
- There is no provision for 'danger pay' within the collective agreement

## **IPAC/OHSW Issues:**

- Ongoing efforts to ensure appropriate level of PPE remain available
- Designated space available for safe donning and doffing.
- PPE stock is being maintained for easy access by staff and inaccessible by residents
- Now have adequate supply of sanitizer
- NW uses a microfiber system for cleaning; this is different than NSHA employees are used to but in compliance with facility standard
- IPAC team working with Northwood staff to review PPE best practices
- IPAC signage will be used as reminders for staff
- Employees will continue to be swabbed in compliance IPAC and OHWS protocols

### **Practice Issues:**

- Second CNE reassigned so support can be provided to each unit Work being done with the NW Educator to develop orientation that will be used for staff coming to facility for the first time
- NW and NSHA are working together to ensure all on same page with provision of care
- Wrist bands will be used for residents who are not in private rooms (where they can be easily identified) or when a resident is identified as needing one (ie. if resident wanders)

We are working to support employees, recognizing that this new work environment is quite different than what they are used to at the Halifax Infirmary. As employees have questions and concerns, they should raise any issue directly with their HSM so that it can be addressed in a timely manner.

Given our joint goal is to support Northwood in the provision of safe care in their response to COVID19, we recommend that a regular meeting be arranged in order to discuss questions or concerns that have not been able to be resolved directly with the HSM. It is important to

remember and acknowledge that we are all doing our best to support safe quality care in a constantly changing environment during this pandemic crisis.

**Subject:** Action needed ASAP at Northwood.

This information is what we've obtained from our members as reported to us by our ERO Trish MacDonald. I would appreciate a response to this today. Please acknowledge receipt of this.

We are conducting two calls this evening with both shifts going on and coming of the floors at Northwood. These workers need protection.

# Here is what needs to be in place at NW:

- 1. You need strong nurses in be in Charge. They have their present CN Michelle, she needs to continue in her role. In addition, another RN there is Rowena, she needs to be one as well.
- 2. Andrea Jenkins is a casual RN with over 20 years of nursing I believe. I have spoken to her and she is willing to work in a short assignment and also be in a charge role. She will work Monday-Friday or shift work but no nights. So either have here in charge are use her as the Resource Nurse who can go to the different units and help nurses who have questions or issues and help problem solve,
- 3. These nurses will get things organised, as I don't know how many units there are, but they need to get armbands on the patients so they can identify them, determine who is a CODE

- and who is not. They have no kardexes with patient information, these are documents that give quick detail about patients and what their needs are for care and deficits and if they require full or partial care. They will schedule proper breaks for the nurses on the day shifts. There should also be a designed nurse charge on each unit for the night shifts, just like their unit if working at NSHA.
- 4. These Charge Nurses can look after staffing and ensuring the model of care they require and staff according with the NW workers that are there and keep the flow of care and update families with questions and concerns. This is lacking greatly, family are not being kept informed.
- 5. They need to have an educator on site with them, as well as an Infection Control there on a regular basis until things are set up and staff are NW staff are educated and following NSHA infection control protocols. After that they should be at least on site daily to assist and answer questions. If they are off site they need to be accessible by pager to the staff.
- 6. The staff need to have a contact person on nights in case there are issues and it be on every unit telling them who they are to contact. For instance will his be the Bed Manager at the HI site or the manager on Call with NSHA, contacted through Locating.
- 7. They need our housekeepers on site, as it seems like the place needs a complete overhaul. There needs to be deep cleaning done initially and then cleaning coming through several times a day on each unit and restocking wipes, doing another clean and getting rid of the biohazard wastes of the PPES on a regular basis.
- 8. Does each unit have a ward clerk, if not this is something to consider for a least a clerk for two units, as they will need help.
- 9. They need to have the proper PPEs at all time. I have suggested that they be wearing N95 masks covered with a surgical mask, the surgical can be discarded and they could wear the N95 for the day, as the surgical mask will protect the N95. Then need to ensure they have face shields, as there is lots of coughing going on.
- 10. Each unit needs to have a clean space that they can change into clean PPEs each shift and a dirty space to get out of these clothes. They also need to get cotton scrubs , as they have provided them with polyester and they are too hot to work in and ensure that they are available.
- 11. They also need a designated clean space to chart, and it needs to maintain clean, as this was not being followed. No one is to be in that area with dirty PPEs on.
- 12. The patients that are on the dementia floor need to be kept in their rooms, not running around the unit and touching the PPEs that nursing and other HC workers will be using
- 13. They will need sitters for some of the dementia patients or are they planning on using their CCAs to sit with these patients
- 14. Hotel accommodations, as they don't want to go home to their families
- 15. A list of casuals that are willing to work there, knowing that once they work there, they should not be working back in acute care. It will be too risky for them to come back to acute.

Current state

502 staff deployed to support the various components of CZ COVID 19 response, with

approximately 200 of these supporting Northwood.

- Staff deployed from areas where activity was reduced (Peri Op, ambulatory, inpatient units & Rehab & Supportive care services).
- Closed 5B at VG to free up staff to be deployed to DGH to support secondary assessment and inpatient unit.
- Staff from 8.4 deployed to Northwood (approx. 50); another 150 plus deployed to Northwood
- Staff from VG and HI being deployed to support some opened capacity at 8.4 (ILI low risk plus one line for HMU)

Fifty five LTC patients moved to LTC facilities; 26 transferred Non Veterans transferred to Veterans in March; LTC flow has slowed significantly, with 122 patients waiting for LTC placement in the zone currently, with utilization of CTU, Veterans and Community & Rural Sites maximized.



Thank you so much for your support of the Northwood at this difficult time. I'm not the MOH that follows this facility regularly, so while I don't have full details, I do know that the testing strategy has been aggressive, and if applicable, iterative, with repeated testing of residents. Typically, if there is a single case on a unit the entire unit is then swabbed. There is also swabbing based on the units where positive staff have worked while infectious (included up to 2 days before symptom onset). The director of the facility could certainly provide more specific details. As Wendy mentioned, there is a meeting tomorrow with the lead MOH supporting this facility, myself and Dr. Strang. The ongoing testing strategy will be one of the topics covered. Wendy – perhaps I could have Dr. Daniela Kempkens connect back to you tomorrow? She will be the MOH on-call and also has been following this outbreak.

Hello All,

I spoke with Dr. Jennifer Cram, MOH (included in this e-mail) and Ann Morgan, assigned Public Health Nurse. As of 1800 there are 80 positive COVID residents. There have been over 400 swabs completed with some residents being swabbed 2-3 times. Not all residents of NW have been swabbed. There remains some floors with no swabbing as no symptoms exist.

Dr. Cram does not believe swabbing is required tonight. She is meeting with Dr. Strang and the other MOH at 0830 and will have further direction post this call. Dr. Cram you may have additional details to share.

#### Messaging

Our team at NSHA has been working collaboratively with our colleagues at Northwood as they respond to a COVID-19 outbreak at their Halifax campus – offering assistance through our emergency preparedness, planning, analytics, medical, clinical, infection control and other teams.

Our collective priority is the safety of residents and staff. Safe work environments and strong infection prevention and control practices are important in every health care setting, and especially those with a COVID-19 outbreak.

Staff and physicians have mobilized to provide help to the facility-based care team. We currently have more than 100??? staff including nurses, infection control, continuing care staff and rehab therapists working at Northwood. We have relocated a COVID-19 Unit from the QEII Halifax Infirmary to Northwood to help support the acute care needs of residents. Residents with COVID-19 are being treated onsite and testing is also being conducted there. In addition, several NSHA physicians in geriatrics, family practice and COVID units are providing consultation to the physicians at Northwood.

Staff who have been relocated to Northwood are working in a different setting than they're accustomed to and with a different patient

population. We understand that they would be unaccustomed to the model of care and some of the differences they've been experiencing--but it's the right model for the people being cared for. We are working to support employees and want to thank everyone who is providing care and support to the residents.

#### Expanded FIT testing model for N95 respirators: Frequently Asked Questions

NSHA is introducing an expanded FIT testing model for N95 respirators to ensure that staff who are working with COVID-suspect or confirmed cases and who may need to perform aerosol-generating procedures are FIT tested to a variety of N95 respirators.

We are making this change to ensure that those staff and physicians who need N95s will be able to receive and start using their supply without delay.

Please read the questions and answers below to learn more about this change and what it means for you.

## Why is NSHA introducing an expanded FIT testing model for N95 respirators?

Many respirators are manufactured overseas. We're well aware that global markets could shift and change; many countries are limiting exports. As a result, we are launching an expanded fit testing model to ensure staff are fit tested to all procured models.

Our biggest challenge has been in purchasing 1870+ models. Knowing that a significant number of health care workers have been FIT tested to this model, we are expanding FIT testing to include 1870 and 1860 models, which we have in stock. A third model, Harley L-188, has been procured but has not yet arrived.

Recognizing many health care workers were fit tested to the 1870+ we will be quickly expanding the FIT test model to include these new respirators. If you were previously FIT tested to an 1870+ and you work in a high-consumption area such as COVID units, Critical Care, Respiratory Therapy, Anesthesia, Emergency, Airway teams, etc., Occupational Health, Safety and Wellness will be working with your leadership to coordinate additional FIT testing. Refer to your FIT testing card to confirm on which N95 model you were FIT tested.

- When will staff and physicians in my area be FIT tested?

  FIT testing will start in areas most affected by COVID and where aerosolgenerating medical procedures (AGMP) are most likely to occur, beginning in
  Central Zone this week (April 14), and then rolling out to other zones. As we
  have dates and areas confirmed, we will reach out to managers with more
  details.
- If I was FIT tested before, do I need to be FIT tested again? How will I know? If you were FIT tested before for an 1870+ N95 respirator, you will now need to be FIT tested for the 1870 and 1860. This will ensure you have the option to use all available respirators. Please refer to your FIT testing card to confirm the model on which you were FIT tested.



- Is there a shortage of N95s respirators?

  No. We are happy to report a significant volume of N95 respirators have been procured. While this is good news, we must continue to adhere to PPE guidelines to ensure that our supply is available to see us through a prolonged response.
- Why don't we fit all health care workers for N95 respirators?

  Use of N95 respirators is based on infection prevention and control guidelines for communicable disease management. Given COVID-19 is spread by droplets and is not an airborne virus, N95s are still to be used only for aerosol generating medical procedures. Staff who are working in patient care areas are to wear a procedure mask.



#### Healthcare Worker Masking Guidelines during COVID-19 Pandemic

### Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

\*PLEASE NOTE: This information was originally shared April 7, 2020 and was last updated April 14, 2020. The information is subject to change.

After careful consideration and in alignment with many other health care facilities across Canada, the Nova Scotia Health Authority (NSHA) will be implementing a new practice around masking of its health care workers (HCW) during the COVID-19 pandemic. Specifically, physicians and staff working in or moving through patient care areas will be asked to wear a procedure mask throughout their entire shift at all sites. One (1) procedure mask per shift will be distributed by unit/team leadership to the HCW. Unit managers will have access to additional masks should they be required.

For information regarding the distribution/collection of masks at the start of your shift, please contact your manager or designate.

#### 1. Which staff members should wear masks?

- Any HCWs who have any face-to-face (direct) or indirect contact with patients in a patient care area should wear a mask. If you are uncertain if you are included in this definition, please contact your manager.
- Staff members who do not work in patient areas and are not patientfacing do not require masks. They are asked to work at home whenever possible, practice social distancing when at work, perform hand hygiene regularly, and not come to work when ill.
- Masks should only be worn on days when working in a patient care area.

#### 2. Why are we being asked to wear the same mask throughout the day?

- Several other provinces have seen a rapid increase in the prevalence of COVID-19 in their communities, leading to outbreaks at long-term care homes and exposures in hospitals. As we begin to see increasing community spread in Nova Scotia (NS), we want to be ahead of this situation.
- Some staff have been coming to work with mild symptoms, which they do not necessarily perceive to be an infection, or coming to work well and then developing mild upper respiratory tract infection symptoms while on duty. This poses a safety risk to our patients and other staff that can result in significant exposures and require quarantine/isolation of staff.
- We are therefore taking increased measures to ensure the continued safety of staff and patients.
- Given the expected challenge in maintaining our supply of PPE, this strategy, if used well, may conserve our supply of procedure masks while enhancing the safety of patients and HCWs.
- If your mask becomes soiled or wet (including sweaty) throughout your



shift, your manager will have a supply of additional masks.

## 3. We have been asked to wear a mask at all times during our shift. When can I remove the mask?

- The mask should be removed whenever a staff member is taking a break, eating a meal, or using the restroom. Social distancing (2 metres) **MUST** be maintained at all times when not wearing a mask.
- Remove the mask using the straps, fold lengthwise from top to bottom (with the front (patient-facing) side in and the side that will be against your face out) (see video)
  - The mask should be stored in a safe place in a clean, dry paper bag labeled with your name). The bag should be discarded after each use.
  - A personal locker If readily available, the mask may be stored in a locker with a hook. Pay close attention not to contaminate the mask in this space.
  - Make sure that the mask can be clearly identified as yours: put your name on the bag before use
- Meticulous hand hygiene should occur before and after removing your mask and before putting the mask back on the face.

# 4. When is it appropriate to DISCARD my mask and use a new one? If your mask gets soiled during the course of your shift, you can request an additional mask as needed. Your mask should be discarded and replaced when:

- Visibly soiled.
- It makes direct contact with a patient.
- It becomes so moist/humid that its integrity is affected (this includes sweat).

#### 5. How can I tell if my mask is soiled and should be discarded?

- If the mask is directly exposed to respiratory droplets (saliva/cough/sneeze).
- If you touch the mask accidently with visibly soiled hands, it should be replaced.
- If your mask is soaked with sweat.
- Note: If the mask is covered with a face shield that was properly placed to completely cover the face, the mask is protected from these droplets.

## 6. How often should I discard and replace the paper bag in which I'm storing my mask?

The paper bag should be discarded after each use.



#### 7. What if I get a mask that doesn't fit properly?

It's important that your mask fits you properly so that it doesn't fall off. Please talk to your supervisor if you've been given a mask that does not fit properly.

#### 8. Why are we not giving patients masks?

Patients are screened upon admission for respiratory symptoms and risk factors. Those who are suspected or confirmed to have COVID-19 are put on droplet and contact precautions. Given the potential for PPE shortage, we have elected not to provide inpatients with masks for source control unless they are out of their rooms for necessary medical tests and procedures.

9. Why are different kinds and colours of procedure masks being provided to NSHA staff? Do all of these masks meet the same quality standards? NSHA has been following a number of different leads to secure personal protective equipment such as procedure masks. It's important to note that Supply Chain only follows up on PPE that adheres to very specific and rigorous Health Canada Standards. You can rest assured that any PPE supplied by NSHA meets these safety standards, regardless of whether there are slight differences in appearance or colour.

#### 10. Can I bring my OWN procedure masks?

No. At this time, NSHA does not support personnel bringing in their own supply of masks. Our procedure masks are controlled for quality and we cannot be sure that masks coming from elsewhere meet our quality standards without additional evaluation.

#### 11. Can health care workers wear homemade masks at work?

No. Health care workers are advised to wear surgical masks, as we cannot validate the efficacy of homemade masks in preventing the spread of infection.

12.Do I need to replace my mask after entering a Contact Isolation room?

No. If you have not met any of the above criteria to discard the mask, you do NOT need to replace the procedure mask. Perform diligent hand hygiene after exiting the room.

# 13. What if I need to be present during an aerosol-generating medical procedure (AGMP) with a patient who has been identified as a suspect or confirmed COVID-19 case?

- Perform hand hygiene and remove your procedure mask (place in dedicated bag/storage area - see above).
- Don a fit-tested N95 Respirator and whichever PPE is required based on additional precautions posted outside the room (read signage carefully, may include gloves/gown/face shield).



• Upon leaving the room, doff PPE appropriately. After performing hand hygiene, re-don your procedure mask.

#### 14. What do I do if I walk into a droplet precautions room?

- Don eye protection (e.g.: googles, face shield)
  - If a face shield is used, the procedure mask can continue to be used as the face shield acts as a barrier preventing the mask from being exposed to respiratory droplets.
  - If goggles are used, the procedure mask you are wearing will need to be discarded and a clean one put on. You will need to have a clean mask available outside the room to be available when the old mask is removed just before you leave the droplet precautions room.
- Disposable face shields are to be discarded after use; reusable face shields are to be cleaned and disinfected after each use. As the situation evolves, the reuse of disposable face shields will be re-evaluated and will be communicated to staff if instructions change.
  - When exiting the room, doff PPE in prescribed order (gloves, gown, hand hygiene, eye protection, mask, hand hygiene). Do not forget to disinfect goggles or the reusable face shields if used.
- Don your assigned procedure mask after performing hand hygiene.

# 15. Does the one mask per shift apply to perioperative staff? Perioperative staff will continue their regular practice of using one mask per patient case in surgery, changing to a new mask between cases.

#### 16. How else can I protect myself?


- Avoid touching the mask unless necessary for donning/doffing and then, only by the straps
- Ensure you are wearing the procedure mask appropriately
  - o The mask should fully cover your mouth and nose
  - o Pull the mask down to cover your chin
  - o Press down to mold the metallic strip over the bridge of your nose.
- Do not partially remove the mask by pulling down under your chin. The
  mask is either fully on, or fully off. Do not hang the mask around your
  neck or from your ear.
- Avoid touching the mask at all times.
- If you must readjust the mask, or are donning/doffing for the reasons described above, ensure you perform hand hygiene immediately before and after doing so. Do not adjust the mask with a gloved hand.
- Clean your hands before and after touching the mask for any reason.
- Clean your hands before and after every patient contact.
- Do NOT come to work when ill. Contact Occupational Health as soon as possible if you do become ill.



### 17. What else do I need to think about?

- Do NOT attempt to sanitize/clean the procedure mask.
- If you have discarded your allocated mask, report to the unit where you acquired your mask at the beginning of the shift to request a new one.

I have been contacted by our nurses at NW this am. They are finding the masks that are provided uncomfortable and then they started to examine the packaging of the masks. I have provided you the packing of what they are being provided, this product is from China. There is no information on the packaging to tell then what is the level of the protection of the mask. I have also included a picture of the box of the products that are supplied at NSHA. I thought they were being provided the same protection. This is very concerning to me, especially for the nurses working on 1 Center, the dementia unit, where the patients are roaming. I would have thought if NW could not

## provide the level of protection to our nurses that they obtained at NSHA, then NSHA would have provided the appropriate masks fro them.

They were also dropped off N95 masks, also produced in China. They have holes in the masks, and they will be insuring that no one wears them. For one they would have to be fit tested again, these are from Wuhan and not the type of N95 provided by NSHA. Those N95 masks at NSHA, there are two types of N95, the duck bill and the come. However, these look like very poor quality, as they took a picture wearing one with a surgical mask underneath and it was still gapping on the side.

The nurses are requesting that they be provided with the information of the level of protection of the mask that is being provided. They would like to see some literature as well about these masks, as they are concerned and how many microns is each mask and the quality of the mask itself. For example are they 80,120 or 160 microns, I will assume they are not 120 and certainly not 160.

I look forward to hearing from you and I will be forwarding my email of the nurses' concerns to NSGEU.



I am writing in follow-up to the questions about the masks at Northwood plus other questions about NSHA masks and FIT testing. The following people were consulted to respond to these questions: Patsy Rawding, Manager for Infection Control, Procurement at Northwood, Evan Cheung, Director of Supply Chain Operations, and Angela Keenan, Manager Occupational Health Safety & Wellness.

- Procedural/Surgical masks the minimum standard for droplet protection is 60 mm Hg
  (this measures fluid resistance see definition below). There are several different masks
  in circulation right now and Infection Control has worked with procurement to ensure all
  makes and models of surgical masks being brought in meet or exceed the required
  standards.
- Regarding procedural/surgical masks, NSHA has received and distributed several different models from several different suppliers. Most of what is currently being distributed is from our usual supplier PriMED. Some models are not the same as the ones that we typically use. Some of the federal shipments that have arrived are also PriMED masks. All procedural/surgical masks distributed meet or exceed ASTM Level 1 standards (they are a minimum of 80 mm Hg or higher).
- Regarding procedural/surgical masks at Northwood, Northwood also has several types
  of procedural/surgical masks in use. Some of the masks do not show the fluid
  resistance level on the box itself. Patsy reviewed all types of procedural/surgical masks
  at Northwood with their procurement and then, connected with Aaron Munro in our
  NSHA procurement as the NSHA has also purchased the same brands of masks and had
  reviewed the technical information to ensure they met the standard. All masks being
  used by Northwood meet the ASTM standard or the European equivalent EN 14683. All

- were found to be 80mm Hg or above. These are also being used at the NSHA as well. Northwood also received a shipment of masks form the federal supply.
- Most masks do come from China and/or parts of them come from China and they may be assembled in a different country. A Staff Masking FAQ has been attached, please refer to question 9 which speaks to why some masks may look different than others.
- Additional disposable gowns have been supplied to Northwood from the DHW stockpile.
- N95 masks are not required by staff at Northwood as they are and will not be performing Aerosol Generating Medical Procedures.
- All 3M N95 masks used by NSHA meet NIOSH N95 standards. So does the Harley L-188.
   Both are listed as approved respirators on the CDC site.

- 3M N95 masks currently in circulation within NSHA include: models 1860, 1860s, 1870, 1870+ & 8210. We did receive a shipment of Chinese N95 masks (Harley L-188) but we have not yet FIT tested staff to this model. OHSW continues to work with Procurement and the Provincial PPE Working Group to identify suitable N95's to ensure that staff have the right PPE, for the right job, at the right time. A FAQ regarding the FIT testing strategy has been attached to this email.

Josh is available to respond to any questions and can review this information with staff tomorrow. We will also be requesting that the information about the various masks be shared again in the next COVID 19 update so other staff who see unfamiliar supplies have this information as well.

**Fluid Resistance:** Fluid resistance reflects the surgical mask's ability to minimize the amount of fluid that could transfer from the outer layers through to the inner layer as the result of a splash or spray. ASTM specifies testing with synthetic blood at pressures of 80, 120, or 160 mm Hg to qualify for low, medium, or high fluid resistance. These pressures correlate to blood pressure: 80 mm Hg = venous pressure (Level 1), 120 mm Hg = arterial pressure (Level 2), and 160 mm Hg (Level 3) correlates to potential high pressures that may occur during trauma, or surgeries that include high pressure irrigation such as orthopedic procedures.

Hi Jason and Trish

Please see our responses below.

In the initial 24 hours of relocating staff from 8.4 to Northwood (NW), in accordance with the Ministerial Directive, there has been a tremendous amount of work accomplished. NSHA employees are currently providing care to residents on two units as follows:

- 11 Manor; 11<sup>th</sup> floor unit with a capacity of 16 and an occupancy of 12
- 1 Centre; 1<sup>st</sup> floor unit with a capacity of 22-23 beds and is fully occupied

In an effort to provide you with an overview of actions taken to date, we can summarize as follows:

#### Staffing/Management/HR:

- Health Services Manager is on site and has shared his contact information with employees if needed during evenings and/or overnight
- Both units have Charge Nurse assigned, based on a long week/short week rotation and work will continue around defining roles on the unit. There will not be an additional short

- assignment added.
- Additional support is available from the NW Facility Supervisor, IPAC, Professional Practice, etc
- The unit aide from 8.4 has been relocated to NW and clerical support will be there as of tomorrow
- There is space available for staff to enjoy rest breaks
- NW has offered accommodations and meals
- Getting process in place to ensure staff have access to the COVID hub for reference and information
- Setting up charting process, interim measures have been put in place while we arrange for access to electronic system
- There is no provision for 'danger pay' within the collective agreement

#### **IPAC/OHSW Issues:**

- Ongoing efforts to ensure appropriate level of PPE remain available
- Designated space available for safe donning and doffing.
- PPE stock is being maintained for easy access by staff and inaccessible by residents
- Now have adequate supply of sanitizer
- NW uses a microfiber system for cleaning; this is different than NSHA employees are used to but in compliance with facility standard
- IPAC team working with Northwood staff to review PPE best practices
- IPAC signage will be used as reminders for staff
- Employees will continue to be swabbed in compliance IPAC and OHWS protocols

#### **Practice Issues:**

- Second CNE reassigned so support can be provided to each unit Work being done with the NW Educator to develop orientation that will be used for staff coming to facility for the first time
- NW and NSHA are working together to ensure all on same page with provision of care
- Wrist bands will be used for residents who are not in private rooms (where they can be easily identified) or when a resident is identified as needing one (ie. if resident wanders)

We are working to support employees, recognizing that this new work environment is quite different than what they are used to at the Halifax Infirmary. As employees have questions and concerns, they should raise any issue directly with their HSM so that it can be addressed in a timely manner.

Given our joint goal is to support Northwood in the provision of safe care in their response to COVID19, we recommend that a regular meeting be arranged in order to discuss questions or concerns that have not been able to be resolved directly with the HSM. It is important to

remember and acknowledge that we are all doing our best to support safe quality care in a constantly changing environment during this pandemic crisis.

This information is what we've obtained from our members as reported to us by our ERO Trish MacDonald. I would appreciate a response to this today. Please acknowledge receipt of this.

We are conducting two calls this evening with both shifts going on and coming of the floors at Northwood. These workers need protection.

#### Here is what needs to be in place at NW:

- 1. You need strong nurses in be in Charge. They have their present CN 20.Perso she needs to continue in her role. In addition, another RN there is 20.Perso she needs to be one as well.
- is a casual RN with over 20 years of nursing I believe. I have spoken to her and she is willing to work in a short assignment and also be in a charge role. She will work Monday-Friday or shift work but no nights. So either have here in charge are use her as the Resource Nurse who can go to the different units and help nurses who have questions or issues and help problem solve,
- 3. These nurses will get things organised, as I don't know how many units there are, but they need to get armbands on the patients so they can identify them, determine who is a CODE

- and who is not. They have no kardexes with patient information, these are documents that give quick detail about patients and what their needs are for care and deficits and if they require full or partial care. They will schedule proper breaks for the nurses on the day shifts. There should also be a designed nurse charge on each unit for the night shifts, just like their unit if working at NSHA.
- 4. These Charge Nurses can look after staffing and ensuring the model of care they require and staff according with the NW workers that are there and keep the flow of care and update families with questions and concerns. This is lacking greatly, family are not being kept informed.
- 5. They need to have an educator on site with them, as well as an Infection Control there on a regular basis until things are set up and staff are NW staff are educated and following NSHA infection control protocols. After that they should be at least on site daily to assist and answer questions. If they are off site they need to be accessible by pager to the staff.
- 6. The staff need to have a contact person on nights in case there are issues and it be on every unit telling them who they are to contact. For instance will his be the Bed Manager at the HI site or the manager on Call with NSHA, contacted through Locating.
- 7. They need our housekeepers on site, as it seems like the place needs a complete overhaul. There needs to be deep cleaning done initially and then cleaning coming through several times a day on each unit and restocking wipes, doing another clean and getting rid of the biohazard wastes of the PPES on a regular basis.
- 8. Does each unit have a ward clerk, if not this is something to consider for a least a clerk for two units, as they will need help.
- 9. They need to have the proper PPEs at all time. I have suggested that they be wearing N95 masks covered with a surgical mask, the surgical can be discarded and they could wear the N95 for the day, as the surgical mask will protect the N95. Then need to ensure they have face shields, as there is lots of coughing going on.
- 10. Each unit needs to have a clean space that they can change into clean PPEs each shift and a dirty space to get out of these clothes. They also need to get cotton scrubs , as they have provided them with polyester and they are too hot to work in and ensure that they are available.
- 11. They also need a designated clean space to chart, and it needs to maintain clean, as this was not being followed. No one is to be in that area with dirty PPEs on.
- 12. The patients that are on the dementia floor need to be kept in their rooms, not running around the unit and touching the PPEs that nursing and other HC workers will be using
- 13. They will need sitters for some of the dementia patients or are they planning on using their CCAs to sit with these patients
- 14. Hotel accommodations, as they don't want to go home to their families
- 15. A list of casuals that are willing to work there, knowing that once they work there, they should not be working back in acute care. It will be too risky for them to come back to acute.





Thank you so much for your support of the Northwood at this difficult time. I'm not the MOH that follows this facility regularly, so while I don't have full details, I do know that the testing strategy has been aggressive, and if applicable, iterative, with repeated testing of residents. Typically, if there is a single case on a unit the entire unit is then swabbed. There is also swabbing based on the units where positive staff have worked while infectious (included up to 2 days before symptom onset). The director of the facility could certainly provide more specific details. As Wendy mentioned, there is a meeting tomorrow with the lead MOH supporting this facility, myself and Dr. Strang. The ongoing testing strategy will be one of the topics covered. Wendy – perhaps I could have Dr. Daniela Kempkens connect back to you tomorrow? She will be the MOH on-call and also has been following this outbreak.

I spoke with Dr. Jennifer Cram, MOH (included in this e-mail) and Ann Morgan, assigned Public Health Nurse. As of 1800 there are 80 positive COVID residents. There have been over 400 swabs completed with some residents being swabbed 2-3 times. Not all residents of NW have been swabbed. There remains some floors with no swabbing as no symptoms exist.

Dr. Cram does not believe swabbing is required tonight. She is meeting with Dr. Strang and the other MOH at 0830 and will have further direction post this call. Dr. Cram you may have additional details to share.

#### Messaging

Our team at NSHA has been working collaboratively with our colleagues at Northwood as they respond to a COVID-19 outbreak at their Halifax campus – offering assistance through our emergency preparedness, planning, analytics, medical, clinical, infection control and other teams.

Our collective priority is the safety of residents and staff. Safe work environments and strong infection prevention and control practices are important in every health care setting, and especially those with a COVID-19 outbreak.

Staff and physicians have mobilized to provide help to the facility-based care team. We currently have more than 100??? staff including nurses, infection control, continuing care staff and rehab therapists working at Northwood. We have relocated a COVID-19 Unit from the QEII Halifax Infirmary to Northwood to help support the acute care needs of residents. Residents with COVID-19 are being treated onsite and testing is also being conducted there. In addition, several NSHA physicians in geriatrics, family practice and COVID units are providing consultation to the physicians at Northwood.

Staff who have been relocated to Northwood are working in a different setting than they're accustomed to and with a different patient

population. We understand that they would be unaccustomed to the model of care and some of the differences they've been experiencing—but it's the right model for the people being cared for. We are working to support employees and want to thank everyone who is providing care and support to the residents.



#### Expanded FIT testing model for N95 respirators: Frequently Asked Questions

NSHA is introducing an expanded FIT testing model for N95 respirators to ensure that staff who are working with COVID-suspect or confirmed cases and who may need to perform aerosol-generating procedures are **FIT tested to a variety of N95 respirators.** 

We are making this change to ensure that those staff and physicians who need N95s will be able to receive and start using their supply without delay.

Please read the questions and answers below to learn more about this change and what it means for you.

## • Why is NSHA introducing an expanded FIT testing model for N95 respirators?

Many respirators are manufactured overseas. We're well aware that global markets could shift and change; many countries are limiting exports. As a result, we are launching an expanded fit testing model to ensure staff are fit tested to all procured models.

Our biggest challenge has been in purchasing 1870+ models. Knowing that a significant number of health care workers have been FIT tested to this model, we are expanding FIT testing to include 1870 and 1860 models, which we have in stock. A third model, Harley L-188, has been procured but has not yet arrived.

Recognizing many health care workers were fit tested to the 1870+ we will be quickly expanding the FIT test model to include these new respirators. If you were previously FIT tested to an 1870+ and you work in a high-consumption area such as COVID units, Critical Care, Respiratory Therapy, Anesthesia, Emergency, Airway teams, etc., Occupational Health, Safety and Wellness will be working with your leadership to coordinate additional FIT testing. Refer to your FIT testing card to confirm on which N95 model you were FIT tested.

- When will staff and physicians in my area be FIT tested?

  FIT testing will start in areas most affected by COVID and where aerosolgenerating medical procedures (AGMP) are most likely to occur, beginning in
  Central Zone this week (April 14), and then rolling out to other zones. As we
  have dates and areas confirmed, we will reach out to managers with more
  details.
- If I was FIT tested before, do I need to be FIT tested again? How will I know? If you were FIT tested before for an 1870+ N95 respirator, you will now need to be FIT tested for the 1870 and 1860. This will ensure you have the option to use all available respirators. Please refer to your FIT testing card to confirm the model on which you were FIT tested.



- Is there a shortage of N95s respirators?

  No. We are happy to report a significant volume of N95 respirators have been procured. While this is good news, we must continue to adhere to PPE guidelines to ensure that our supply is available to see us through a prolonged response.
- Why don't we fit all health care workers for N95 respirators?

  Use of N95 respirators is based on infection prevention and control guidelines for communicable disease management. Given COVID-19 is spread by droplets and is not an airborne virus, N95s are still to be used only for aerosol generating medical procedures. Staff who are working in patient care areas are to wear a procedure mask.



## Healthcare Worker Masking Guidelines during COVID-19 Pandemic

## Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

\*PLEASE NOTE: This information was originally shared April 7, 2020 and was last updated April 14, 2020. The information is subject to change.

After careful consideration and in alignment with many other health care facilities across Canada, the Nova Scotia Health Authority (NSHA) will be implementing a new practice around masking of its health care workers (HCW) during the COVID-19 pandemic. Specifically, physicians and staff working in or moving through patient care areas will be asked to wear a procedure mask throughout their entire shift at all sites. One (1) procedure mask per shift will be distributed by unit/team leadership to the HCW. Unit managers will have access to additional masks should they be required.

For information regarding the distribution/collection of masks at the start of your shift, please contact your manager or designate.

#### 1. Which staff members should wear masks?

- Any HCWs who have any face-to-face (direct) or indirect contact with patients in a patient care area should wear a mask. If you are uncertain if you are included in this definition, please contact your manager.
- Staff members who do not work in patient areas and are not patientfacing do not require masks. They are asked to work at home whenever possible, practice social distancing when at work, perform hand hygiene regularly, and not come to work when ill.
- Masks should only be worn on days when working in a patient care area.

#### 2. Why are we being asked to wear the same mask throughout the day?

- Several other provinces have seen a rapid increase in the prevalence of COVID-19 in their communities, leading to outbreaks at long-term care homes and exposures in hospitals. As we begin to see increasing community spread in Nova Scotia (NS), we want to be ahead of this situation.
- Some staff have been coming to work with mild symptoms, which they do not necessarily perceive to be an infection, or coming to work well and then developing mild upper respiratory tract infection symptoms while on duty. This poses a safety risk to our patients and other staff that can result in significant exposures and require quarantine/isolation of staff.
- We are therefore taking increased measures to ensure the continued safety of staff and patients.
- Given the expected challenge in maintaining our supply of PPE, this strategy, if used well, may conserve our supply of procedure masks while enhancing the safety of patients and HCWs.
- If your mask becomes soiled or wet (including sweaty) throughout your



shift, your manager will have a supply of additional masks.

# 3. We have been asked to wear a mask at all times during our shift. When can I remove the mask?

- The mask should be removed whenever a staff member is taking a break, eating a meal, or using the restroom. Social distancing (2 metres) **MUST** be maintained at all times when not wearing a mask.
- Remove the mask using the straps, fold lengthwise from top to bottom (with the front (patient-facing) side in and the side that will be against your face out) (see video)
  - The mask should be stored in a safe place in a clean, dry paper bag labeled with your name). The bag should be discarded after each use.
  - A personal locker If readily available, the mask may be stored in a locker with a hook. Pay close attention not to contaminate the mask in this space.
  - Make sure that the mask can be clearly identified as yours: put your name on the bag before use
- Meticulous hand hygiene should occur before and after removing your mask and before putting the mask back on the face.

# 4. When is it appropriate to DISCARD my mask and use a new one? If your mask gets soiled during the course of your shift, you can request an

additional mask as needed. Your mask should be discarded and replaced when:

- Visibly soiled.
- It makes direct contact with a patient.
- It becomes so moist/humid that its integrity is affected (this includes sweat).

## 5. How can I tell if my mask is soiled and should be discarded?

- If the mask is directly exposed to respiratory droplets (saliva/cough/sneeze).
- If you touch the mask accidently with visibly soiled hands, it should be replaced.
- If your mask is soaked with sweat.
- Note: If the mask is covered with a face shield that was properly placed to completely cover the face, the mask is protected from these droplets.

# 6. How often should I discard and replace the paper bag in which I'm storing my mask?

The paper bag should be discarded after each use.



#### 7. What if I get a mask that doesn't fit properly?

It's important that your mask fits you properly so that it doesn't fall off. Please talk to your supervisor if you've been given a mask that does not fit properly.

#### 8. Why are we not giving patients masks?

Patients are screened upon admission for respiratory symptoms and risk factors. Those who are suspected or confirmed to have COVID-19 are put on droplet and contact precautions. Given the potential for PPE shortage, we have elected not to provide inpatients with masks for source control unless they are out of their rooms for necessary medical tests and procedures.

9. Why are different kinds and colours of procedure masks being provided to NSHA staff? Do all of these masks meet the same quality standards? NSHA has been following a number of different leads to secure personal protective equipment such as procedure masks. It's important to note that Supply Chain only follows up on PPE that adheres to very specific and rigorous Health Canada Standards. You can rest assured that any PPE supplied by NSHA meets these safety standards, regardless of whether there are slight differences in appearance or colour.

#### 10. Can I bring my OWN procedure masks?

No. At this time, NSHA does not support personnel bringing in their own supply of masks. Our procedure masks are controlled for quality and we cannot be sure that masks coming from elsewhere meet our quality standards without additional evaluation.

#### 11. Can health care workers wear homemade masks at work?

No. Health care workers are advised to wear surgical masks, as we cannot validate the efficacy of homemade masks in preventing the spread of infection.

12.Do I need to replace my mask after entering a Contact Isolation room?

No. If you have not met any of the above criteria to discard the mask, you do NOT need to replace the procedure mask. Perform diligent hand hygiene after exiting the room.

# 13. What if I need to be present during an aerosol-generating medical procedure (AGMP) with a patient who has been identified as a suspect or confirmed COVID-19 case?

- Perform hand hygiene and remove your procedure mask (place in dedicated bag/storage area see above).
- Don a fit-tested N95 Respirator and whichever PPE is required based on additional precautions posted outside the room (read signage carefully, may include gloves/gown/face shield).



• Upon leaving the room, doff PPE appropriately. After performing hand hygiene, re-don your procedure mask.

## 14. What do I do if I walk into a droplet precautions room?

- Don eye protection (e.g.: googles, face shield)
  - If a face shield is used, the procedure mask can continue to be used as the face shield acts as a barrier preventing the mask from being exposed to respiratory droplets.
  - If goggles are used, the procedure mask you are wearing will need to be discarded and a clean one put on. You will need to have a clean mask available outside the room to be available when the old mask is removed just before you leave the droplet precautions room.
- Disposable face shields are to be discarded after use; reusable face shields are to be cleaned and disinfected after each use. As the situation evolves, the reuse of disposable face shields will be re-evaluated and will be communicated to staff if instructions change.
  - When exiting the room, doff PPE in prescribed order (gloves, gown, hand hygiene, eye protection, mask, hand hygiene). Do not forget to disinfect goggles or the reusable face shields if used.
- Don your assigned procedure mask after performing hand hygiene.

# 15. Does the one mask per shift apply to perioperative staff? Perioperative staff will continue their regular practice of using one mask per patient case in surgery, changing to a new mask between cases.


#### 16. How else can I protect myself?

- Avoid touching the mask unless necessary for donning/doffing and then, only by the straps
- Ensure you are wearing the procedure mask appropriately
  - o The mask should fully cover your mouth and nose
  - o Pull the mask down to cover your chin
  - o Press down to mold the metallic strip over the bridge of your nose.
- Do not partially remove the mask by pulling down under your chin. The
  mask is either fully on, or fully off. Do not hang the mask around your
  neck or from your ear.
- Avoid touching the mask at all times.
- If you must readjust the mask, or are donning/doffing for the reasons described above, ensure you perform hand hygiene immediately before and after doing so. Do not adjust the mask with a gloved hand.
- Clean your hands before and after touching the mask for any reason.
- Clean your hands before and after every patient contact.
- Do NOT come to work when ill. Contact Occupational Health as soon as possible if you do become ill.




## 17. What else do I need to think about?

- Do NOT attempt to sanitize/clean the procedure mask.
- If you have discarded your allocated mask, report to the unit where you acquired your mask at the beginning of the shift to request a new one.












- 1) When OCMOH engages senior clinical leads at NSHA our assumption has been that these individuals will connect back as necessary through the NSHA structures to make people aware, assess implications and seek approval. If this is not actually the case then I would suggest that there be an NSHA internal discussion to clarify the necessary processes. OCMOH cannot be having multiple discussions with NSHA on the sane issue.
- 2) I am working with colleagues in DHW to provide a clear, written directive on all the details of the direction to have staff from outside organizations working at the Northwood Halifax campus be required to have a 14-day self-isolation period before returning to work in their home organization

Dr. Watson-Creed:

There are a number of NSHA operational issues that we need greater clarity on to ensure that we are appropriately planning service delivery and COVID response. The information is critical to our ability to adjust our operations and ability to re-introduce services.

I am requesting your assistance in getting timely answers to the following:



- 2. Northwood / Staff Isolation Requirements we received direction that "...any staff and physicians working at and/or deployed to on-site at Northwood must complete 14-days of self-isolation before returning back to work at an NSHA facility." We have questions regarding this direction that will help to understand and manage the operational impact:
  - 1. Is the intent that the staff self-isolate or home-isolate:
    - a. Self-isolation (therefore at home and need to isolate from family)
    - b. Home Isolation permitted to be around others at home.
  - 2. Does this apply to any individual regardless of the number of days worked at Northwood (1 day at Northwood results in 14 day isolation)? Examples:
    - i. Staff go to Northwood to complete bloodwork for patients, and then return to Q11 to complete their assignment.
      - ii. Infection control complete inspections.
    - iii. Interprofessional practice resources supporting onsite guidance/training
    - iv. Physicians that are providing on-site assistance/support.
      - v. Physicians/Management/other meeting on-site.
  - 3. Does this include all staff deployed to provide support (not specific to a COVID unit) working on other resident floors (note that all COVID patients are not located in specific areas but there are some units more impacted)
  - 4. Does this only apply to Northwood or any location where there is an outbreak other LTC; NSHA locations with COVID-positive patients?

Thank you in advance for your assistance with these issues. Both have substantive impact on NSHA resources and clarity is need to allow us to appropriately plan for current services and the re-introduction of services.

Going forward, could we also have a clinical/operational representative from NSHA included in these planning meetings and discussions? This will ensure that the ideas and strategies being considered are also informed by the operational impact within the system. We have requested that requests come through our established EOC email address so we can ensure that one of our VP's of Clinical Operations is able to participate.

I spoke with Dr. Jennifer Cram, MOH (included in this e-mail) and Ann Morgan, assigned Public Health Nurse. As of 1800 there are 80 positive COVID residents. There have been over 400 swabs completed with some residents being swabbed 2-3 times. Not all residents of NW have been swabbed. There remains some floors with no swabbing as no symptoms exist.

Please see our responses below.

In the initial 24 hours of relocating staff from 8.4 to Northwood (NW), in accordance with the Ministerial Directive, there has been a tremendous amount of work accomplished. NSHA employees are currently providing care to residents on two units as follows:

- 11 Manor; 11<sup>th</sup> floor unit with a capacity of 16 and an occupancy of 12
- 1 Centre; 1<sup>st</sup> floor unit with a capacity of 22-23 beds and is fully occupied

In an effort to provide you with an overview of actions taken to date, we can summarize as follows:

# **Staffing/Management/HR**:

This information is what we've obtained from our members as reported to us by our ERO Trish MacDonald. I would appreciate a response to this today. Please acknowledge receipt of this.

We are conducting two calls this evening with both shifts going on and coming of the floors at Northwood. These workers need protection.

#### Here is what needs to be in place at NW:

- 1. You need strong nurses in be in Charge. They have their present CN Michelle, she needs to continue in her role. In addition, another RN there is Rowena, she needs to be one as well.
- 2. Andrea Jenkins is a casual RN with over 20 years of nursing I believe. I have spoken to her and she is willing to work in a short assignment and also be in a charge role. She will work Monday-Friday or shift work but no nights. So either have here in charge are use her as the Resource Nurse who can go to the different units and help nurses who have questions or issues and help problem solve,
- 3. These nurses will get things organised, as I don't know how many units there are, but they need to get armbands on the patients so they can identify them, determine who is a CODE and who is not. They have no kardexes with patient information, these are documents that give quick detail about patients and what their needs are for care and deficits and if they require full or partial care. They will schedule proper breaks for the nurses on the day shifts. There should

- also be a designed nurse charge on each unit for the night shifts, just like their unit if working at NSHA.
- 4. These Charge Nurses can look after staffing and ensuring the model of care they require and staff according with the NW workers that are there and keep the flow of care and update families with questions and concerns. This is lacking greatly, family are not being kept informed.
- 5. They need to have an educator on site with them, as well as an Infection Control there on a regular basis until things are set up and staff are NW staff are educated and following NSHA infection control protocols. After that they should be at least on site daily to assist and answer questions. If they are off site they need to be accessible by pager to the staff.
- 6. The staff need to have a contact person on nights in case there are issues and it be on every unit telling them who they are to contact. For instance will his be the Bed Manager at the HI site or the manager on Call with NSHA, contacted through Locating.
- 7. They need our housekeepers on site, as it seems like the place needs a complete overhaul. There needs to be deep cleaning done initially and then cleaning coming through several times a day on each unit and restocking wipes, doing another clean and getting rid of the biohazard wastes of the PPES on a regular basis.
- 8. Does each unit have a ward clerk, if not this is something to consider for a least a clerk for two units, as they will need help.
- 9. They need to have the proper PPEs at all time. I have suggested that they be wearing N95 masks covered with a surgical mask, the surgical can be discarded and they could wear the N95 for the day, as the surgical mask will protect the N95. Then need to ensure they have face shields, as there is lots of coughing going on.
- 10. Each unit needs to have a clean space that they can change into clean PPEs each shift and a dirty space to get out of these clothes. They also need to get cotton scrubs, as they have provided them with polyester and they are too hot to work in and ensure that they are available.
- 11. They also need a designated clean space to chart, and it needs to maintain clean, as this was not being followed. No one is to be in that area with dirty PPEs on.
- 12. The patients that are on the dementia floor need to be kept in their rooms, not running around the unit and touching the PPEs that nursing and other HC workers will be using
- 13. They will need sitters for some of the dementia patients or are they planning on using their CCAs to sit with these patients
- 14. Hotel accommodations, as they don't want to go home to their families
- 15. A list of casuals that are willing to work there, knowing that once they work there, they should not be working back in acute care. It will be too risky for them to come back to acute.

Thank you so much for your support of the Northwood at this difficult time. I'm not the MOH that follows this facility regularly, so while I don't have full details, I do know that the testing strategy has been aggressive, and if applicable, iterative, with repeated testing of residents. Typically, if there is a single case on a unit the entire unit is then swabbed. There is also swabbing based on the units where positive staff have worked while infectious (included up to 2 days before symptom onset). The director of the facility could certainly provide more specific details. As Wendy mentioned, there is a meeting tomorrow with the lead MOH supporting this facility, myself and Dr. Strang. The ongoing testing strategy will be one of the topics covered. Wendy – perhaps I could have Dr. Daniela Kempkens connect back to you tomorrow? She will be the MOH on-call and also has been following this outbreak.

I spoke with Dr. Jennifer Cram, MOH (included in this e-mail) and Ann Morgan, assigned Public Health Nurse. As of 1800 there are 80 positive COVID residents. There have been over 400 swabs completed with some residents being swabbed 2-3 times. Not all residents of NW have been swabbed. There remains some floors with no swabbing as no symptoms exist.





# Purpose: Directive Regarding Healthcare Workers Deployed to Northwood Halifax

To ensure the health and safety of NSHA and IWK healthcare workers, patients and staff and to ensure the health and safety of Northwood Halifax residents, health care workers and staff, all health care workers providing direct ongoing patient care

at Northwood Halifax are hereby required to self-isolate for fourteen (14) days prior to returning to work at any NSHA or IWK facility.

### This directive

- has been issued due to the outbreak of COVID-19 at the Northwood Halifax Campus;
- is effective as of May 7, 2020; and
- applies to all physicians, NSHA /IWK staff, healthcare workers including but not limited to Registered Nurses (RNs), Licenced Practical Nurses (LPNs) and Continuing Care Assistants (CCAs) who provide ongoing direct patient / client care at Northwood Halifax.

### Mandatory requirements

- . The NSHA and IWK must communicate this directive to all physicians, healthcare workers, other staff who are currently, or may be in the future, deployed to Northwood Halifax and expected to return to work in a NSHA or IWK facility.
- . The requirements for isolation at home during the 14 day period will be consistent with the requirements for isolation at home under work isolation, which are permissive of essential trips outside the home if there are no other options providing a non-medical mask is worn.

We want to assure you that all employees working at Northwood are receiving the personal protective equipment as recommended by both the World Health Organization and the expert IPAC physicians in Nova Scotia. We want to assure you that Northwood has a solid supply of personal protective equipment to keep both employees and residents safe.

Safe work environments and infection control are important at every healthcare work setting and especially those with a COVID outbreak. Safety and infection control are so important that two infection control practitioners on have been onsite at Northwood each day since Sunday to support the efforts Northwood staff were already undertaking. 

**Subject:** REQUEST FOR ACTION: Provincial Response Planning for LTC

### Dear NSHA EOC:

Over the past few days we have learned from the implementation of the LTC clinical pathways at Northwood. DHW has reflected that we should revisit our planning assumptions and discuss any shifts or add-ons to the LTC clinical pathways. By way of this message, we are requesting a subsequent discussion about the provincial response plan to LTC. Essentially we are looking to revalidate our planning assumptions and response plans.

**Action:** We are looking for confirmation on participating in this discussion and feedback on the agenda.

**Timeline:** Meeting on Friday or Monday

### **Proposed Agenda**

- Discussion of lessons learned from current outbreaks (i.e. Northwood)
  - Clinical approach
  - HHR/HR clinical, IPAC, OHS, site coordination, administration, etc.
  - Supply and PPE
- Reflection questions/discussion:
  - Quality/Clinical Pathways. Our planning assumption that we will face an surge in hospitals may need to be revisited as we flatten the curve and observe low volumes/occupancy in hospitals. It also appears that this wave of the pandemic will impact LTC more than hospital settings. What is the appropriate

- approach to caring for (COVID19) residents in LTC? Is our transfer policy still appropriate?
- Sustainability/Capacity. NSHA is leading/supporting on 8 LTC outbreaks.
   What is NSHA's capacity should this increase? How might we improve the sustainability of our collective approach?
- Integration/Whole System Approach. We have effectively converted Northwood into a hospital annex. Is this approach suitable elsewhere (other zones)? Should we be looking at identifying other locations to "hospitalizing LTC" and hotels for recovered patients? Previously we discussed converting RCF to LTC, given the current approach is this still recommended?

#### 1.0 INTRODUCTION

The Long Term Care Program Requirements: Nursing Homes and Residential Care Facilities document, also referred to as program requirements, outlines the Department of Health and Wellness' expectations for licensed nursing homes and residential care facilities across Nova Scotia.

The Department is committed to the delivery of safe, high quality, holistic, resident-centred care for Nova Scotians residing in long term care facilities. Choice, empowerment, autonomy, flexibility, privacy, community linkages and the trend of moving away from the institutional model of care are inherent concepts in these program requirements. This document sets out the fundamental requirements and the requirements for resident care, administration, information management, human resource management, service quality, service continuity, human resource management and physical space.

These program requirements provide a mechanism for internal and external reviews and must be implemented in a manner that reflects the requirements of the Department of Health and Wellness. Compliance is monitored as part of the licensing process and ensures that homes operate within the established criteria and are committed to continuous quality improvement. The Department has authority under the *Homes for Special Care Act* to enter and inspect nursing homes and residential care facilities in Nova Scotia.

Aligned with the *Homes for Special Care Act (HSCA) and Regulations*, these program requirements ensure that program content is consistent with other relevant legislation including, but not limited to, the *Protection for Persons in Care Act (PPCA)*, the *Personal Health Information Act (PHIA)* and the *Personal Directives Act (PDA)*.

This document replaces all previous Long Term Care Program Requirements, including the 2007 Long Term Care Program Requirements developed in association with the 2007 Request for Proposal (RFP), and reflects the minimum acceptable standards for nursing homes and residential care facilities licensed by the Department of Health and Wellness in Nova Scotia. Unless otherwise noted, all nursing homes and residential care facilities that are licensed by the Department of Health and Wellness must meet the stated program requirements. In the event of a current or future discrepancy between these program requirements and legislation, the more stringent requirements shall apply.

#### 3.0 LONG TERM CARE PRINCIPLES

The Long Term Care Program Requirements: Nursing Homes and Residential Care Facilities document is guided by the principles listed below:

#### Resident and Family Focused:

- 1. Residents' privacy is respected and their health information is protected.
- 2. Residents maintain choice and self-determination even as their need for support increases.
- 3. Activities and services are designed to maximize residents' abilities.
- 4. Flexible scheduling of activities of daily living is supported.
- 5. Residents and families are encouraged to be partners in care.
- 6. A holistic approach to resident-centred care that addresses physical, social, cultural, mental and spiritual well-being is supported.
- 7. Opportunities for meaningful relationships, interactions and companionship with residents, family, staff members and the community are provided.
- 8. A clean, accessible, comfortable and secure homelike environment is provided for residents and their families.

#### Staff focused:

- 9. A supportive, safe and efficient workplace is provided for staff.
- 10. Occupational and organizational health, well-being and safety of staff members are supported.
- 11. Innovative models of care are encouraged through a resident-centred approach to care.

#### 4.0 GLOSSARY

The following definitions apply to the *Long Term Care Program Requirements:* Nursing Homes and Residential Care Facilities:

**Abuse**: Any of the following (as defined by the *Protection for Persons in Care Regulations*, Section 3(1):

- a) the use of physical force resulting in pain, discomfort or injury, including slapping, hitting, beating, burning, rough handling, tying up or binding;
- b) mistreatment causing emotional harm, including threatening, intimidating, humiliating, harassing, coercing or restricting from appropriate social contact;
- c) the administration, withholding or prescribing of medication for inappropriate purposes;
- d) sexual contact, activity or behaviour between a service provider and a patient or resident;
- e) non-consensual sexual contact, activity or behaviour between patients or residents;
- f) the misappropriation or improper or illegal conversion of money or other valuable possessions; and
- g) failure to provide adequate nutrition, care, medical attention or necessities of life without valid consent.

**Acute Home Care**: Home care services provided to a resident with a need for time limited intervention with a goal of improving a medical or post-surgical condition.

**Adverse Event:** An unexpected and undesired incident directly associated with the care or services provided to the resident or the environment in which the care is provided.

**Aesthetic Integrity**: No visible soiling, staining, discolouration or physical damage.

**Assessment**: A process for collecting and interpreting information obtained through various reliable sources for the purposes of determining residents' abilities, needs and potential for maintaining or improving their health.

**Authorized Designates:** Persons to whom the licensee shall communicate, as the case may be, on behalf of residents who do not have capacity, such as:

- a) a person to whom the resident has given authorization, under the *Medical Consent Act*; to give consent or directions respecting medical treatment;
- b) a guardian, under the *Incompetent Persons Act*; authorized to manage financial matters;
- c) a delegate or statutory decision-maker, under the *Personal Directives Act*, with authority to make personal care decisions; and/or

d) an attorney, under the *Powers of Attorney Act*, authorized to manage financial matters.

**Business Continuity Plan:** Arrangements and procedures that enable an organization to respond to a significant event that affects normal operations and to return to normal operational functions after the interruption.

**Complaint:** Expression of concern or dissatisfaction to or about the home, either verbally or in writing.

**Compromised Functionality:** Reduced working order or not fully functional.

**Confidential:** Information that shall be safeguarded from disclosure and that has defined parameters for distribution.

**Consent:** Voluntary and informed agreement by a resident, who is competent and understands the information and appreciates its implications, or the resident's authorized designate.

**Corrective Action**: The plan that is developed, implemented and evaluated in response to an identified issue of concern in order to mitigate risk.

**Credential:** The issuance by an authority of documentation to attest to the individual's possession of the requisites for a specific designation.

**Critical Incident:** A serious event, affecting either the resident, staff or the public.

**Department**: The Department of Health and Wellness.

**Disclosure of Adverse Event**: The imparting of information from the licensee to residents, or their authorized designates, regarding any adverse event affecting the resident.

**Emergency Power System:** An electrical generator, its switchgear, fuel system and, in some cases, its own storage building.

**Environmental Services:** Housekeeping and laundry functions.

**Ethics:** Moral principles and values.

**Evaluation:** The measurement of the degree of achievement toward the desired outcome.

**Evidence-based Decision-making:** The process of making decisions based on a theoretical body of knowledge and using the best available scientific evidence.

**Family Council:** A forum for families to have a voice in decisions that affect them and their loved ones and to improve the quality of residents' lives.

**Functional Integrity:** Able to perform and performing as originally intended.

**Holistic:** Emphasizing the importance of the whole person and the interdependence of body systems.

**Home:** A Nursing Home, Home for the Aged or Residential Care Facility that is licensed by the Department of Health and Wellness under the *Homes for Special Care Act*.

**Homelike:** A warm and inviting space which residents and/or family members are encouraged to personalize.

**Incident:** Any occurrence, including a near-miss situation, which has the potential to cause personal injury, disease or death, or property damage.

**Incident Report:** A document which records an incident, its investigation, a root cause analysis and the corrective action taken by the licensee.

**Indicator:** A performance measurement tool used to identify specific data that has significance.

**Information Management:** The means by which an organization efficiently plans, collects, organizes, uses, disseminates, and disposes of its information and through which it ensures that the value of that information is identified and exploited to its fullest extent.

**Interdisciplinary Assessment**: Team members from a variety of disciplines work together with the resident and/or authorized designates and family members to complete a comprehensive resident assessment.

**Interdisciplinary Care Conference**: A team meeting that includes the care staff, resident and/or authorized designate and family, and focuses on the resident for the purpose of communication, planning, coordination and evaluation of the resident's care.

**Interdisciplinary Team:** Team members from a variety of disciplines, the resident and/or authorized designate and family members who participate in the assessment, planning, implementation and evaluation of a resident's care.

**Intergenerational Programs:** Recreational programs that focus on the sharing of experiences between different age groups.

**Leading Practice**: Processes, systems or methods that have been shown to produce superior results.

**Licensee:** The owner/operator, administrator, board of directors or service provider to whom a license has been issued by the Department of Health and Wellness to operate a nursing home or residential care facility in Nova Scotia.

**Mission:** A clearly written statement of the home's purpose that focuses the direction and character of its programs and services encompassing a statement of philosophy.

**Nursing Home:** A building or place or part of a building or place, including Homes for the Aged, in which accommodation and skilled nursing care are provided to residents in accordance with the *Homes for Special Care Act, Section 2(1) (j)*.

**Nursing Care:** The use of methods, procedures and techniques employed in providing nursing care by persons with technical nursing training beyond the care that an untrained person can adequately administer.

**Outbreak**: An increase in the number of cases of disease or infection above the number normally occurring in the home over a defined period of time. Outbreak definitions may be more specific based on the microorganism/illness.

**Outcome:** The desired end result of the purpose or objective that shall be achieved.

**Palliative Care**: Care that improves the quality of life of patients/families facing life threatening illness, through the prevention and relief of suffering by means of early identification, assessment and treatment of pain and other problems (physical, psychological and spiritual). It includes end-of-life care for those who are dying and a palliative approach to care for those with advanced illness or at increased risk of dying.

**Partners in Care:** Mutually beneficial partnership among the resident, their authorized designate, family and care providers supporting respectful relationships and active engagement of all in planning, developing and accessing care.

**Personal Care:** The provision of supervision and assistance with activities of daily living for a person who is ambulatory or semi-ambulatory in accordance with the *Homes for Special Care Act*, *Section 2(1)(k)*, including, but not limited to, health care, nutrition, hydration, shelter, residence, clothing, hygiene, safety, comfort, recreation, social activities, and support services.

#### **Personal Directive:** The document that:

- a) sets out instructions or an expression of the maker's values, beliefs and wishes about future personal-care decisions to be made on his or her behalf; and
- b) authorizes one or more persons who, except in the case of a minor spouse, is or are of the age of majority to act as delegate to make, on the maker's behalf, decisions concerning the maker's personal care, as defined in the *Personal Directive Act*, Section 3(1).

**Plan of Care**: The documented actions that the interdisciplinary team shall undertake to meet the identified needs, goals and preferences of the resident. The plan's rationale, goals, benefits, and expected outcomes are based on the assessment, planning, implementation and evaluation process.

**Point of care:** The place where the resident, care staff and care procedure come together.

**Point of Care Risk Assessment (for infection, prevention and control):** An activity whereby:

- a) the likelihood of exposure to an infectious agent is evaluated for a specific interaction, with a specific resident, in a specific environment (e.g., single room, hallway), under available conditions (e.g., no designated handwashing sink); and
- b) the appropriate actions/personal protective equipment needed to minimize the risk of exposure, for the specific resident, other residents in the environment, staff, visitors, contractors, etc, are utilized.

**Policy:** A written statement that reflects leading practices and identifies and interprets a position on a given issue, providing direction, limits, responsibility, accountability and expectations.

**Preventive Maintenance Program**: Maintaining equipment and facilities in satisfactory operating condition by providing for systematic inspection, detection and correction of incipient failures either before they occur or before they become major defects.

**Privacy:** Free from undue intrusion; the right of individuals to control or influence what information related to them may be collected and stored and by whom and to whom that information may be disclosed.

**Procedure:** A written set of instructions conveying the approved and recommended steps for an action or sequence of actions.

**Program Requirement:** The established standard with which a licensee must be in compliance in order to be licensed by the Department of Health and Wellness as a nursing home or a residential care facility.

**Qualified:** Possesses the capabilities, competencies, skills and experience necessary to successfully operate within the scope of his/her position.

**Quality Improvement:** The efforts taken to improve the level of performance of a process through measurement of the current level of performance, identifying ways to improve that performance, and the implementation of new and promising practices.

**Resident:** A person who lives in a home licensed by the Department of Health and Wellness.

**Resident-Centred:** An approach in which residents are viewed as whole persons; it is not merely about delivering services where the resident is located. Resident-centred care involves advocacy, empowerment, and respecting the resident's autonomy, voice, self-determination and participation in decision-making.

**Resident Council:** A forum for residents and/or authorized designates to have a voice in decisions that affect the residents and to improve the residents' quality of life in the home.

**Residential Care Facility:** A building or place, or part of a building or place, where supervisory or personal care is provided to three or more persons.

**Resident Values:** A written set of value statements that govern and guide resident and staff relationships.

**Responsive Behaviours:** Actions, words or gestures of people with dementia utilized as a means of communicating unmet need(s) and/or something important in their personal, social or physical environment (e.g. wandering, restlessness, agitation, physical resistance) which may cause distress and/or risk for the person, other residents, family members, visitors and/or staff.

**Restraint:** Anything that is intentionally used to limit the movement or behaviour of a resident and over which the resident has no control. Restraints may be physical, environmental or chemical. A resident is restrained if he or she cannot remove a physical device, leave a specific area, or refuse a chemical restraint.

Risk: Potential for harm.

**Risk Management:** A system for the detection, evaluation, prevention and mitigation of risks.

**Safety Alerts:** Hazards, alerts, recall notifications or warning notices that document faults or defects of products and may include recommendations on what corrective action(s) should be taken to reduce the possibility of injury.

**Substitute Decision Maker (SDM):** The delegate or statutory decision-maker with the legal authority to make personal care decisions on behalf of an individual who lacks capacity to make health care decisions pursuant to the *Personal Directives Act*.

**Supervisory Care:** The provision of room, board and (i) guidance or supervision in the activities of daily living, or (ii) observation or surveillance of the physical well-being of a person who is ambulatory or semi-ambulatory.

Surface Integrity: The surface material is continuous and sound.

**Values:** A fundamental set of beliefs that clearly communicate the vision and how the licensee will operate on a day-to-day basis.

**Vision:** A clear visualization of a future for which the licensee strives and which guides all of the home's activities.

**Wound:** An injury to the body that typically involves laceration or breaking of a membrane, (such as the skin), and usually damage to underlying tissues (Merriam-Webster Dictionary). Includes pressure injuries.

#### 5.0 FUNDAMENTAL REQUIREMENTS

#### 5.1 Resident Respect, Dignity and Right to Privacy

#### Outcome:

Residents are respected and their dignity and right to privacy are preserved.

#### The licensee shall ensure:

- 1. A privacy and confidentiality policy and procedures, that reflect the Long Term Care Principles and align with legislation, are developed and implemented.
- 2. Residents are treated with respect and dignity at all times, including during:
  - a) personal care activities;
  - b) consultation with and examination by professional staff;
  - c) intimacy; and
  - d) social contacts with families and friends.
- 3. Residents' privacy is protected to the extent possible.
- 4. There is a statement of values posted in common areas and residents are provided with a copy upon admission to the home.
- 5. Residents receive services that support inclusiveness and respect both diversity and cultural differences.
- 6. Staff members receive information regarding the home's values, respect, dignity and protection of privacy upon hire and as part of their ongoing professional development.
- 7. Residents have their own clothing, which are appropriate, correct in size, clean and neat, in good repair and suitable for the climate.
- 8. Staff members address residents using residents' preferred names.
- 9. Residents, or their authorized designates, receive mail unopened.

#### 5.2 Resident Choice

#### Outcome:

Residents exercise choice and have control over their lives.

#### The licensee shall ensure:

 The culture of the home, through its mission, statement of values, philosophy and provision of care, maximizes the ability of residents to exercise personal autonomy and choice.

- 2. Staff members support residents and/or authorized designates in making informed decisions.
- 3. Residents' informed decisions are respected including their decisions regarding personal directives and sharing of their information.
- 4. Residents' right to choose is reflected in the development and implementation of their individualized plan of care.
- 5. Residents or their authorized designates decide the extent to which family members, friends and others are involved in their care, including end of life care.
- 6. Residents are able to express religious, spiritual, sexual and cultural beliefs and practices.
- 7. Residents are encouraged to personalize their bedrooms with their personal possessions in a manner that is safe and practical.
- 8. Residents and/or their authorized designates manage their financial affairs.

#### 5.3 Family and Community Relationships

#### Outcome:

Residents maintain relationships with family, friends and the local community as they choose.

#### The licensee shall ensure:

- 1. Upon admission, residents and/or their authorized designates receive written information about the home's philosophy on supporting and encouraging resident involvement with family, friends and the community.
- 2. All residents or authorized designates provide an emergency contact.
- 3. There is no restriction on visitors except:
  - a) when requested by the residents or their authorized designates;
  - b) when a visitor is deemed by the licensee to pose a security risk or to negatively impact other residents or the operations of the home;
  - c) where there is a Protective Intervention Order pursuant to the *Adult Protection Act* in place; or
  - d) as necessary during an outbreak of infection.

#### 6.0 RESIDENT CARE

#### 6.1 Assessments

Outcome:

Residents' individual needs are identified through appropriate, relevant assessments.

#### The licensee shall ensure:

- 1. Policies and procedures that reflect leading practices regarding assessments are developed and followed.
- 2. Ongoing assessments are completed in order to identify the unmet changing needs of the residents.
- 3. Results of assessments are documented on the resident record, are communicated appropriately to staff and become the basis for the resident plan of care.
- 4. Residents and/or authorized designates are advised of alternative care options when residents' needs can no longer be met by the home.

#### **Additional Requirements for Nursing Homes**

The licensee shall ensure:

- Residents have an interdisciplinary assessment of risk, functional abilities, cognition, nutrition, oral health (see section 6.6), pain and discomfort, falls risk, and recreation, initiated upon admission to the home and completed within two weeks.
- Residents have a skin integrity assessment completed within 24 hours of admission to the home, and on an ongoing basis in accordance with the residents' individual needs.
- 6. A lift and transfer assessment is completed for residents within 24 hours of admission and as the residents' individual needs change.
- 7. When residents are exhibiting responsive behaviours, the interdisciplinary team assesses the residents to determine the underlying causes of the behaviour, identifies the type and level of risk, and develops, communicates and evaluates the plan of care and outcomes in accordance with section 6.3, Individual Plan of Care.

#### **Additional Requirements for Residential Care Facilities**

The licensee shall ensure:

8. Collection of residents' current information, regarding functional abilities, risks, cognition, diet, oral health, pain and discomfort, falls, and recreation, is initiated upon admission to the home and completed within two weeks.

9. Collection of residents' current information regarding skin integrity is completed within 24 hours of admission to the facility, and on an ongoing basis in accordance with the residents' individual needs.

#### 6.2 Health Services

#### Outcome:

The best possible resident health outcomes are achieved by meeting residents' assessed health care needs.

#### The licensee shall ensure:

- 1. Ethical, informed decision-making, staff-resident collaboration and staff teamwork are supported to enhance residents' long term care experiences.
- 2. Relationship building between and among residents, authorized designates, families and staff is encouraged.
- 3. Residents, authorized designates and families are supported in their care partner roles.
- 4. Staff members get to know the residents so they can better understand their unique needs, preferences and personal histories.
- 5. Staff members make decisions based on knowledge of the residents' needs and they work cooperatively to meet their needs.
- 6. Residents receive advocacy and support according to their needs, as appropriate.
- 7. Residents receive assistance and support with activities of daily living, as required, having regard for their plan of care.
- 8. Residents' health status is monitored daily and there is a system in place to recognize indicators of residents' changing needs and to respond accordingly.
- 9. Interventions are in accordance with resident goals of care, clinical guidelines, leading practices and the professional regulatory/licensing bodies.
- Residents' access to specialized health care services is facilitated, according to their individualized care needs, e.g., acute home care, palliative care, wound care and mental health.
- 11. Resident care protocols, based on current leading practices, are developed, implemented, monitored and regularly evaluated with particular emphasis on responsive behaviours, skin integrity, poly-pharmacy, pain, wound management, infection control, nutrition and daily mouth care.
- 12. Residents are under the care of qualified medical practitioners of their choice who

- agree to provide services in the home.
- 13. The home has a physician medical advisor.
- Pharmaceutical services are provided to ensure the medication needs of residents are met.

#### **Additional Requirements for Nursing Homes**

The licensee shall ensure:

- 15. An interdisciplinary pharmacy committee, consisting of at least the Administrator of the Home, Medical Advisor, Pharmacist, Director of Resident Care and Clinical Dietitian, meets a minimum of every six months.
- 16. A stand-alone Wound Care Committee is implemented, or wound care issues/practices are included as a standing agenda item on another appropriate committee (i.e. Quality Committee). The committee shall be interdisciplinary ensuring that wound prevention and management is regularly reviewed and revised to reflect leading practices and provincial direction, and identify trends for quality improvement.

#### Additional Requirements for Residential Care Facilities

The licensee shall ensure:

17. A process is in place (e.g., a committee) to review wound care issues/practices to ensure wound prevention and management is regularly reviewed and revised to reflect leading practices and provincial direction, and identify trends for quality improvement.

#### 6.3 Individual Plan of Care

#### Outcome:

Each resident's abilities and preferences are maximized through the individualized plan of care.

The licensee shall ensure:

- 1. Policies and procedures related to resident care planning are developed and followed.
- An interdisciplinary care conference, that includes the resident and/or authorized designate and the family members approved by the resident, is conducted within six weeks of admission to the home and annually thereafter, or more frequently as the resident's individual needs require.
- 3. The care conference results in a mutually agreeable, documented plan of care.
- 4. Each resident has a plan of care which:
  - a) includes the plan's rationale, measurable and achievable goals, benefits,

- expected outcomes, detailed actions that the interdisciplinary team shall undertake to meet the resident's identified needs and time frames for evaluation;
- b) is reviewed by staff on a quarterly basis, or more frequently as required, and is updated to reflect the resident's changing needs and interventions; and
- is communicated to the resident and/or authorized designate and all those involved in the resident's care.
- 5. Interventions, outcomes and resident progress are regularly evaluated and the plan of care is modified as needed and documented on the resident record.
- 6. Staff members document timely, clear, objective and complete information on the resident record.
- 7. Each resident has an opportunity to complete or provide a personal directive which includes identifying a substitute decision maker. If completed, the personal directive will be placed on the resident record. Otherwise, it is documented on the record that a personal directive was discussed with the resident.
- 8. For residents who do not have capacity, their authorized designates are advised as soon as possible of changes in the residents' health status.
- 9. Residents and/or authorized designates are encouraged to have funeral arrangements completed and communicated to the licensee.

#### **Additional Requirements for Nursing Homes**

The licensee shall ensure

10. Each resident's plan of care is based on the risks and needs identified in the interdisciplinary assessments referenced in section 6.1, Additional Requirements for Nursing Homes, and the resident's choice.

#### **Additional Requirements for Residential Care Facilities**

11. Each resident's plan of care is based on the needs identified through the collection of resident information, referenced in section 6.1, Additional Requirements for Residential Care Facilities.

#### 6.4 Resident-Centred Care

#### Outcome:

Residents' quality of life and well-being are enhanced through the provision of resident-centred care.

The licensee shall ensure:

1. Resident-centred care, which recognizes the value of providing a safe, homelike

- environment with an emphasis on meeting the physical, health, cultural, spiritual, social, mental and emotional needs of residents, is provided for all residents.
- 2. Every effort is made to support residents in maximizing their independence, capabilities and freedom of choice to the extent of their abilities.
- 3. Staff members work with the residents and/or authorized designates as a team to determine what works best for the residents.
- 4. Team members learn collaborative problem solving and share responsibility, as well as accountability, for resident outcomes.
- 5. Resident-centred care:
  - a) supports residents, their authorized designates and families to be partners in care by promoting choice, empowerment, autonomy and independence in everyday life:
  - b) provides a clear statement of role expectations where team work is emphasized;
  - c) encourages decision-making by residents and/or their authorized designates and staff members who work closely with the residents;
  - d) enables flexible scheduling of activities of daily living to meet residents' preferences whenever possible;
  - e) supports innovative approaches to care delivery; and
  - f) enables staff to consistently work with the same residents, when in the residents' best interests.

#### 6.5 Nutrition

#### Outcome:

Residents' nutritional requirements are met through a balanced diet. Their individual needs are accommodated and their preferences are obliged, whenever possible.

#### The licensee shall ensure:

- Policies and procedures regarding food services, that reflect leading practices in public health, safe food production and professional standards, are developed and followed. This includes receiving, storage, production and delivery of meals, snacks and supplements and appropriate safety measures to guide visitors who bring in food for residents.
- 2. The following processes are developed and followed:

- a) identification and communication of residents' food allergies, preferences, therapeutic diets, food textures, supplements and food contraindications;
- b) provision of food and beverages for mealtimes and snacks at safe, comfortable and palatable temperatures according to residents' individual needs;
- c) labeling of food in refrigerators and discarding of expired food;
- d) tracking and monitoring intake of meals, supplements and fluids as required;
- e) documenting and monitoring residents' weights; and
- f) receiving input from residents and/or authorized designates and families regarding the menu.
- Menus are balanced according to Canada's Food Guide and provide flexibility to meet nutrition guidelines and interventions as identified for residents' specific needs and preferences.
- 4. Menus follow a rotation that is not less than 4 weeks. Menus are posted and any changes are documented and align with the dietician's recommendations.
- 5. Planned menus offer choices/alternatives based on residents' needs, including entrees, vegetables, desserts and beverages, for regular and therapeutic meals and texture modified diets. Seasonal items are incorporated into the menu.
- 6. A minimum of three meals and two snacks, one of which is an evening snack, are provided at appropriate intervals throughout the day. Snacks include both food and fluids with options for residents with therapeutic and texture modified diets.
- 7. The meal system provides some flexibility to offer meals/snacks/fluids throughout the day.
- 8. Meals are served in accordance with leading practices and residents' preferences with no more than 15 hours between suppers and breakfasts unless otherwise documented. Meals are served based on the wishes and needs of the majority of residents.
- 9. Supervision and assistance are provided during meals, snacks and other food related activities as necessary.
- 10. There is a staff member on duty in the dining area, during meals, snacks and other food related activities (including on-site and off-site activities), who has current training on the maneuver for clearing the airway of a person who is choking.
- 11. Relevant staff members are educated on safe food practices in accordance with current legislation.
- 12. Assistive devices and eating aids are provided for residents who require them to eat/drink safely.

- 13. Residents are encouraged to eat in the dining room. Alternate arrangements based on residents' needs may be made, provided there is adequate supervision.
- 14. Mealtimes provide a positive, relaxed and quality dining experience that stimulates the senses, appetite and conversation. Every effort is made to limit noise and interruptions.
- 15. The dining environment promotes residents' enjoyment, safety, comfort, independence and dignity, allowing them to socialize and to eat at a pace that suits them. There are ongoing opportunities to evaluate and improve the dining experience for the residents.
- 16. A written hydration therapy program is implemented and maintained.
- 17. A Vitamin D supplementation program is in place in accordance with the Department of Health and Wellness' guidelines.

#### **Additional Requirements for Nursing Homes**

The licensee shall ensure:

- 18. Diets are provided according to residents' needs, following assessments by the dietitian, with consideration for residents' likes and dislikes, religious beliefs, culture and abilities.
- 19. Menus are reviewed, approved and dated by a registered dietitian at least twice per year.

#### **Additional Requirements for Residential Care Facilities**

The licensee shall ensure:

- 20. Diets are provided according to the residents' needs, with consideration for residents' likes and dislikes, religious beliefs, culture and abilities.
- 21. Menus are reviewed, approved and dated by a registered dietitian at least once per year.

#### 6.6 Oral Health

Outcome:

Residents' oral health is optimized through an effective mouth care regime.

The licensee shall ensure:

- An oral health assessment is initiated on admission and completed by staff within two weeks.
- Any risks relating to oral status (such as pain, swelling, bleeding, broken or decayed teeth, debris and food particles) are documented on admission and monitored regularly by staff in order to initiate appropriate referrals to dental professionals, when required and desired by the resident or authorized designate, and to inform daily mouth care planning.

3. Each resident has a daily mouth care plan that includes appropriate hygiene techniques and products to maintain oral cleanliness of natural teeth and/or dentures.

#### 6.7 Recreation

#### Outcome:

Residents' range of leisure programming reflects their expectations and preferences and satisfies their physical, social, cultural, spiritual, emotional, mental and recreational interests and needs.

#### The licensee shall ensure:

- 1. Policies and procedures for recreational programming are developed and followed.
- 2. A recreational program is developed and implemented that:
  - a) allows members of the care team to assist and support the continuous development of programs for the changing needs of the residents;
  - b) is in keeping with the residents' needs, preferences, abilities and strengths;
  - c) is flexible, innovative and varied to respond to the residents' leisure needs and interests; and
  - d) is planned, with input from residents and/or authorized designates and family councils, a minimum of one month in advance.
- 3. A monthly schedule is posted in common and resident areas. Any changes are documented and posted for residents and authorized designates to view.
- 4. Residents are supported in participating in meaningful activities.
- 5. Residents' participation records of individual and group programs are maintained for planned activities.
- 6. Community affiliations and intergenerational programs are encouraged, nurtured and facilitated.

#### 6.8 Palliative and End of Life Care

#### Outcome:

Residents' dignity is preserved and their physical, emotional, cultural and spiritual needs are met.

#### The licensee shall ensure:

1. A policy and procedures regarding end of life care are documented and followed.

- 2. Residents and/or authorized designates are engaged in planning for residents' end of life care.
- 3. Upon admission, and as needed, there is evidence of discussion with residents and/or authorized designates about options for end of life care including options for the degree of medical intervention.
- 4. Residents'/authorized designates' goals of care and choices are documented accordingly on the plan of care and/or personal directive, if completed, and are placed on the resident record and followed.
- 5. Residents' personal directives, if completed, are reviewed annually with the residents and/or authorized designates or more frequently if required to ensure their care preferences and wishes are clearly understood.
- 6. Residents' religious and cultural practices concerning end of life care are recorded in the resident records and are followed.
- 7. There are procedures in place to direct staff in the event of an expected death or an unexpected death.

#### 7.0 ADMINISTRATION

#### 7.1 Management of the Home

#### Outcome:

Residents live in a home that promotes their quality of life through the effective and efficient management of the home.

#### The licensee shall ensure:

- 1. There is a designated administrator responsible for the overall management of the home.
- 2. On-site administrative authority is delegated to an appropriate individual when the administrator is absent.
- 3. The operation of the home is in compliance with the following:
  - a) all applicable legislation, including but not limited to:
    - the Homes for Special Care Act (HSCA) and Regulations;
    - the Protection for Persons in Care Act (PPCA);
    - the Personal Directives Act (PDA);
    - the Personal Health Information Act (PHIA);
    - the Occupational Health and Safety Act; and
    - the Smoke-free Places Act
  - b) Department of Health and Wellness' Long Term Care Program Requirements: Nursing Homes and Residential Care Facilities and any other relevant provincial policies, standards and requirements.
- 4. A statement of the home's mission, vision, values and philosophy of care is developed; staff are knowledgeable about them and demonstrate them through their actions.
- 5. The policies listed in Appendix A and accompanying procedures, and any other policies and procedures deemed necessary by the licensee, are developed, documented and implemented.
- 6. The policies and procedures are maintained and easily accessed by staff. They are reviewed regularly with staff to ensure they are knowledgeable about them and demonstrate them through their actions.
- 7. The home's policies are reviewed a minimum of every three years, or more frequently as required to ensure they are current, and they are revised as needed.
- 8. A policy for the collection and management of resident funds is developed and implemented.

- 9. A policy for receiving, investigating and resolving complaints is developed and implemented.
- 10. On admission, residents and/or authorized designates are provided with the following:
  - a) written information regarding the complaint process;
  - b) written information about the services provided by the home; and
  - c) a list of the home's policies, relevant to residents and families, and copies are provided upon request.
- 11. Residents and/or authorized designates are kept informed of operational issues that may impact residents' care or well-being.
- 12. Required inspections of the home and equipment are completed and documentation is maintained to demonstrate compliance with requirements. These include, but are not limited to, manufacturer requirements, safety requirements, sprinkler systems, water testing, fire alarms and fuel systems.

### 7.2 Resident Councils

### Outcome:

Residents and/or authorized designates are provided with regular opportunities to meet with management to discuss issues relating to residents' care and well-being and the safety and security of the home.

- 1. The home has a resident council that has a documented Purpose and Terms of Reference.
- 2. Policies and procedures regarding the establishment of a functioning resident council are developed and followed. This includes a process for managing the funds raised through council activities.
- 3. Resident council meetings are held monthly. Residents and/or authorized designates are notified of meetings in advance and are encouraged to participate.
- 4. The administrator attends resident council meetings a minimum of quarterly.
- 5. Residents chair the resident council meetings whenever possible.
- 6. Minutes of resident council meetings are maintained and include resolution or action on identified concerns or issues. Minutes are available and easily accessible for viewing by residents.

## 7.3 Family Councils

#### Outcome:

Family members are provided with regular opportunities to meet with management to discuss issues relating to the care and well-being of residents and the safety and security of the home.

## **Requirements for Nursing Homes**

The licensee shall ensure:

- 1. The nursing home has a family council that works together in partnership with the resident council. The family council has a documented Purpose and Terms of Reference.
- 2. Policies and procedures regarding the establishment of a functioning family council are developed and followed. This includes a process for managing the funds raised through family council activities.
- 3. Family council meetings are held a minimum of twice annually. Family members are notified of meetings in advance and are encouraged to participate.
- 4. The administrator attends a minimum of two family council meetings per year.
- 5. Family members chair the family council meetings whenever possible.
- 6. Minutes of family council meetings are maintained and include resolution or action on identified concerns or issues. Minutes are available and easily accessible for viewing.

## 7.4 Management and Staff Meetings

#### Outcome:

Management and staff are kept informed of operational issues that may impact the care of residents, the well-being of residents and staff and the safety and security of the home.

- 1. Policies and procedures describing the roles and responsibilities of formalized management and staff meetings are documented and followed.
- Minutes of management and staff meetings are maintained and include resolution or action on identified concerns or issues. Staff meeting minutes are available and easily accessed by staff.
- 3. Management and staff meetings are held a minimum of quarterly.

## 7.5 Inspections

## Outcome:

Risk is mitigated through regular inspections by all applicable authorities having jurisdiction and through the licensee's compliance with the minimum requirements of those authorities.

- Compliance with all applicable government inspection processes, policies, standards, requirements and service agreements, including but not limited to, the following authorities:
  - a) Department of Health and Wellness;
  - b) Department of Labour and Advanced Education, including Occupational Health and Safety (OHS);
  - c) Nova Scotia Environment;
  - d) Office of the Fire Marshal (OFM); and
  - e) Workers' Compensation Board of Nova Scotia.
- 2. A valid and current Homes for Special Care license to operate is posted in a conspicuous location in the home.
- 3. A current Food Establishment permit is posted, if required by legislation.
- 4. Homes with 12 beds or more are inspected by a Nova Scotia Government Food Safety Specialist a minimum of annually.
- 5. The home is inspected by the Fire Marshal on a regular basis, in accordance with the requirements of the Office of the Fire Marshal.
- 6. Inspection reports, recommendations and requirements from legislated authorities having jurisdiction are retained. Compliance with recommendations and requirements is achieved and evidenced by appropriate documentation.

## 8.0 SERVICE QUALITY

## 8.1 Quality Management

### Outcome:

The home's commitment to continuous quality improvement is evidenced by the provision of integrated, comprehensive quality resident care and services that demonstrate leading practices.

- 1. Quality improvement policies and procedures for continuous quality improvement of resident care are developed and followed.
- 2. Management and staff use research-based, evidence-informed approaches to care and service delivery, which are based on leading practices.
- 3. Policies are consistent with professionally recognized standards of practice for health care professionals employed in the home.
- 4. Resident and family satisfaction surveys are conducted a minimum of annually.
- 5. A process is in place to review the results of the satisfaction surveys and to develop and implement appropriate changes.
- 6. The results of the satisfaction survey are summarized, with resident/authorized designate/family identifiers removed, and are available and easily accessible for viewing.
- 7. Key performance indicators are identified based on strategic health system objectives and health priorities and include, but are not limited to:
  - a) service utilization and access;
  - b) quality, safe care;
  - c) appropriateness of care, clinical characteristics, resident outcomes;
  - d) resident satisfaction;
  - e) financial;
  - f) efficiency, productivity; and
  - g) sustainability.

## 8.2 Risk Management

## Outcome:

Systems and processes are in place to minimize risk to residents, staff, volunteers, visitors and the home.

- 1. Policies and procedures that minimize risk to residents, staff, volunteers, visitors and the home are developed and followed. These include but are not limited to:
  - a) A risk management policy which includes the assessment, identification and management of risk, is developed, implemented and evaluated;
  - b) A critical incident reporting policy and procedures that direct staff in the event of a critical incident;
  - A disclosure of adverse events policy and procedures that direct staff in the event of an adverse event;
  - d) A smoking policy and procedures that address smoking by residents, staff, volunteers and visitors;
  - e) A safer needles in the workplace policy and procedures for the safe management, handling, administration and disposal of needles in the home. The policy and procedures shall be in compliance with the Safer Needles in the Healthcare Workplaces Act;
  - f) A safety alerts policy and procedures that includes information management, follow up actions and risk mitigation;
  - g) A water temperature monitoring policy and procedures to ensure temperatures are in accordance with the appropriate Canadian Standards Association (CSA) standards;
  - h) An extremes of internal temperature policy and procedures to ensure internal temperatures are at acceptable levels; and
  - i) A disclosure of wrongdoing policy and procedures regarding disclosing, reviewing, investigating and tracking concerns about wrongdoing.
  - j) A wound management policy that aligns with these program requirements and the Department of Health and Wellness' Wound Management Policy for Nursing Homes and Residential Care Facilities.
- 2. Risk management programs that minimize risk to residents are developed, implemented and evaluated. These include but are not limited to:

- a) An immunization program that provides safe administration of vaccines, such as influenza, to interested residents and staff; and
- b) A falls prevention program is developed and implemented.
- 3. Risk management processes that minimize risk to residents and staff are implemented. These include but are not limited to:
  - a) A resident identification process, at the time of admission, which includes a photo of the resident and is updated regularly to ensure it clearly identifies the resident;
  - b) A process to direct staff in the event of a missing resident;
  - c) A process for documenting and appropriately communicating resident allergies;
  - d) A process for analyzing critical incidents and adverse events, a minimum of quarterly or more often as required, to identify trends and ensure appropriate action is taken to remedy the identified risks; and
  - e) A process for ensuring staff members are trained in the safe operation of equipment.

### 8.3 Protection of Residents from Abuse

### Outcome:

Residents are protected from all forms of abuse and neglect pursuant to the *Protection of Persons in Care Act.* 

- 1. Compliance with the *Protection of Persons in Care Act* (PPCA).
- 2. Policies and procedures that protect residents from abuse and maintain a reasonable level of safety are developed and followed
- 3. Investigators appointed pursuant to the PPCA are permitted entry to the home at all reasonable times.
- 4. Management and staff cooperate with and provide assistance to investigators as required.
- Compliance with any and all directives received from the Minister of Health and Wellness, or designates, following investigation under PPCA, with respect to protecting residents from abuse.
- 6. All persons who are employed by the licensee, or who are providing services on behalf of the licensee, are provided with education regarding the licensee's policies and procedures related to abuse and the PPCA.

- 7. Where any employee is suspected of abusing a resident, the employee is suspended; the suspicion is reported to the Department of Health and Wellness' PPCA toll free line at 1-800-225-7225; and an investigation and action are taken in accordance with the licensee's policy.
- 8. An allegation of abuse or suspected abuse, which falls under the jurisdiction of the *Criminal Code of Canada*, is reported to the police, the Department of Health and Wellness' PPCA toll free line and the Nova Scotia Health Authority.
- 9. No adverse action is taken against employees, residents, authorized designates or family members who make a report of abuse in good faith.

## **Additional Requirement for Nursing Homes**

The licensee shall ensure:

10. A least restraint policy and procedures are developed and followed.

### 8.4 Infection Prevention and Control

## Outcome:

Residents and staff are protected from exposures and transmissions of microorganisms and infection by knowledgeable staff and evidence-informed infection prevention and control strategies.

- Infection prevention and control policies and procedures, with particular emphasis on proper hand hygiene and routine practices including a point of care risk assessment, are developed and followed. The policies and procedures are reviewed and updated regularly and practice audits are conducted to ensure they are being followed.
- 2. A formal structure is in place to oversee the activities of the infection prevention and control program. A designated person is assigned to oversee infection prevention and control throughout the home.
- 3. A stand-alone Infection Prevention and Control Committee is implemented or infection prevention and control issues/practices are included as a standing agenda item on another appropriate committee. The committee shall be multidisciplinary ensuring that the infection prevention and control program is regularly reviewed and revised to reflect leading practices and provincial direction.
- 4. There is an active program for the prevention, control and investigation of infectious, communicable diseases. This includes the monitoring of infection rates (surveillance) and the sharing of this information, internally and with the Department of Health and Wellness upon request.

- 5. Systems are in place for detecting and responding to outbreaks of infections, with clear mechanisms for consulting with and reporting to Public Health, the Department of Health and Wellness and the Nova Scotia Health Authority.
- 6. The closing of facilities in a pandemic situation is directed by the Department of Health and Wellness.
- 7. Staff education on infection prevention and control practices and outbreak management are provided at orientation for new staff and as part of continuing education.
- 8. Personal protective equipment is available to protect staff, volunteers and visitors as per routine practices and additional precautions.
- 9. The home implements a hand hygiene program which includes the following:
  - a) ensuring staff and residents have access to alcohol-based hand rubs and/or hand washing sinks at the point of care. Alcohol-based hand rubs with an alcohol (i.e., ethanol, isopropanol or *n*-propanol) concentration above 60% and up to 90% should be used:
  - b) ensuring paper towels and liquid hand soap are used in all public and staff hand washing sinks;
  - c) providing education/training based on current guidelines to staff and residents on hand hygiene practices; and
  - d) evaluating staff adherence with hand hygiene practices though auditing and observation.
- 10. If bars of soap and other personal care items are used in resident rooms, they are designated for the use of one resident and are not shared.
- 11. Immunizations or vaccinations for residents and staff are facilitated, recorded and provided to Department of Health and Wellness as directed.
- 12. Staff influenza immunization rates, in homes with greater than 5 employees, are posted in a public place and updated a minimum of twice per year on December 15<sup>th</sup> and on March 1<sup>st</sup>.
- 13. There is an organized laundry system with adequate covered laundry receptacles to maintain a clean and safe service. Clean laundry is separated from soiled laundry.
- 14. Documented processes and practices are followed to ensure staff members adhere to the separation of clean and soiled linen.
- 15. There are designated areas for the collection, processing and disposal of human and bio-medical waste to minimize the transmission of infectious diseases.
- 16. Documented processes and practices for cleaning and disinfecting resident care equipment are followed. E.g. foot care equipment.

- 17. Contracted services shall follow established standards for cleaning and disinfecting environmental surfaces and equipment.
- 18. Spray wands are disconnected from hoppers. Rinsing hoses may remain connected as they do not aerosolize materials.

## 8.5 Medication Management

### Outcome:

Resident health is preserved and risk of harm is mitigated through the safe storage, management and administration of medication.

- 1. Policies and procedures for the management and administration of medications and treatments, including over the counter medications, are developed and followed.
- 2. Prescription and non-prescription medications and treatments are administered only when ordered by authorized prescribers.
- 3. Medications are stored in a secure and appropriate manner, accessible only to persons authorized to administer medications.
- 4. Medications are accounted for, administered and documented in accordance with federal and provincial legislation and professional practice standards.
- 5. There is a process in place for
  - a) reconciling medications upon admission, transfer and discharge;
  - b) tracking narcotics;
  - c) ensuring verbal orders are signed by authorized prescribers no later than 72 hours after the verbal order was issued, in accordance with legislation; and
  - d) documenting medications administered on a PRN basis.
- 6. Preparation of doses for more than one administration time is not permitted.
- 7. Staff members are educated on the safe administration of medication and medication practices at the home.
- 8. Signatures of staff who administer medications are verified annually, or as needed, when a paper based system is utilized.
- 9. Upon admission, residents and/or authorized designates receive a list of over the counter medications that are provided by the home at no charge to the residents.
- 10. All residents have an individual Medication Administration Record (MAR) accompanied by a current resident photograph.

- 11. Resident allergies are documented on the MAR.
- 12. MARs are reviewed and double-checked for accuracy by two authorized staff members before being utilized.
- 13. Pharmaceutical services are provided by qualified pharmacists to ensure the medication needs of residents are met.
- 14. There is a current pharmaceutical reference resource available.
- 15. Discontinued and expired medications are disposed in a safe and appropriate manner.

### 8.6 Ethics

### Outcome:

Resident values are promoted and protected by the consistent application of ethical principles in decision-making.

- 1. A written code of ethics for the home is developed and followed.
- 2. Policies and procedures that address ethical issues are developed and followed.
- 3. There is a documented decision-making process for dealing with ethical issues.
- 4. Processes are in place to address non-compliance with the home's code of ethics.

## 9.0 SERVICE CONTINUITY

## 9.1 Labour Disruption Contingency Plan

### Outcome:

Residents continue to receive quality care and services in the event of a labourmanagement dispute.

#### The licensee shall ensure:

- Essential services continue to be provided to residents when there is a reduction in the number of available staff members due to a labour-management dispute.
- 2. A labour disruption contingency plan, which may be included in the business continuity plan, is developed in consultation with service partners as appropriate.

# 9.2 Emergency Planning and Preparedness

### Outcome:

The safety and well-being of residents and staff are maintained during an emergency situation.

- 1. All Hazards Plan
  - a) There is a documented All Hazards Plan which is reviewed a minimum of every three years and revised as necessary to ensure the plan is current. The All Hazards Plan shall address:
    - · emergency evacuation;
    - emergency relocation;
    - emergency expansion;
    - emergency isolation;
    - bomb threat / suspicious package;
    - external air exclusion;
    - · chemical spill;
    - violent person; and
    - facility access control.
  - b) The All Hazards Plan is exercised a minimum of once every three years. More frequent exercises shall be completed as required to ensure all staff members are knowledgeable. The Business Continuity Plan identified below may be incorporated as part of this exercise.

- c) The participation of staff members is incorporated into the exercise. Participation of residents is included when appropriate and safe. Table top exercises are not accepted as meeting the exercise requirement.
- d) External observers, such as individuals experienced in dealing with emergency situations, are invited to the exercise and asked in advance to provide feedback regarding exercises, testing and debriefing.

## 2. Business Continuity Plan

- a) There is a documented Business Continuity Plan that addresses the operational recovery and continuity of services in the face of a disaster, labour disruption or other major outage. The Business Continuity Plan includes the following:
  - hazard, vulnerability and risk assessment;
  - mission critical activities;
  - recovery strategies;
  - loss of electrical power, water, heat, ventilation and waste water services;
  - loss of information technology (computer / telephone / fax) priorities;
  - geographic footprint; and
  - pandemic situation (pandemic planning is undertaken and completed in accordance with direction received from the Department of Health and Wellness.)
- b) When applicable, business continuity information may be incorporated into the All Hazards Plan.
- c) The Business Continuity Plan is reviewed a minimum of annually and revised as necessary to ensure it is current.

## 3. Staff Call Back Plan

- a) There is a documented Staff Call Back Plan that includes:
  - current staff phone numbers;
  - procedure for staff call back;
  - priority for contacting staff; and
  - how long it will take staff to arrive on site
- b) The Staff Call Back Plan is reviewed a minimum of annually and revised as necessary to ensure it is current.
- c) The Staff Call Back Plan is activated a minimum of once per year to determine the ability of staff members to respond in emergency situations.

## 4. Fire Safety

- a) There is a documented Fire Safety Plan, in accordance with the National Fire Code, that is reviewed a minimum of annually and revised as necessary to ensure the plan is current.
- b) Fire Drills are conducted a minimum of monthly in accordance with direction from the Office of the Fire Marshal.
- c) Fire protection systems are tested and inspected annually, or more frequently as required by the Office of the Fire Marshal.
- d) Fire protection equipment is maintained in good working order. Fire alarms and fire doors are tested monthly; fire extinguishers are inspected monthly and tested annually in accordance with the Office of the Fire Marshal.
- e) Records of testing and inspections of fire protection equipment and systems are maintained.
- f) The Office of the Fire Marshal is requested to inspect the home on a regular basis in accordance with the requirements of the Office of the Fire Marshal.
- g) No resident is maintained in a home or any part thereof that is not approved by the Fire Marshal.
- 5. Contact information in all plans is updated a minimum of quarterly.
- 6. All plans are established in consultation with the following organizations, as appropriate:
  - a) Nova Scotia Health Authority;
  - b) Local Emergency Measures Organization;
  - c) Office of the Fire Marshal, local fire departments, police departments; and
  - d) Emergency Health Services and other persons providing essential services.
- 7. The plans provide for situations where assistance from local fire departments, police departments, Emergency Health Services and other persons providing essential services may not be available.
- 8. Upon initial employment in a home and a minimum of annually thereafter, every staff member is instructed in and understands the contents of the All Hazards Plan, the Fire Safety Plan, the Business Continuity Plan and the Staff Call Back System Plan as applicable to their individual roles.
- 9. Residents are included in the education and training on the All Hazards Plan procedures and fire drills, as appropriate.

- 10. A written record for fire drills and exercises outlined above, that includes the date, time, location, staff attendance, response times, outcomes, areas for improvement, remedial actions and debriefing, is maintained by the licensee.
- 11. A list of emergency and non-emergency names, phone numbers and addresses is posted in an accessible place near a telephone in each home. The list should state, "In the event of an emergency, dial 911" and shall include the local fire department, police department, Emergency Management Office, ambulance services and physicians.

## 10.0 INFORMATION MANAGEMENT

## 10.1 Information System

## Outcome:

Effective information management systems support the provision of quality care through information production, performance measurement and evidence based decision-making.

### The licensee shall ensure:

- 1. The home has an information management system that:
  - a) supports the principles of resident-centred design;
  - b) makes useful, relevant, quality information available to inform decision-making;
  - c) focuses on outcomes related to care provision and service delivery; and
  - d) ensures compliance with the *Personal Health Information Act* (PHIA) *and the Personal Information Protection Electronic Documents Act* (PIPEDA) as well as any other applicable legislation.
- 2. The Department of Health and Wellness and the Nova Scotia Health Authority are advised prior to implementing any new electronic information management system.

### **10.2 Resident Records**

### Outcome:

Resident records are accurate, complete, up to date, and maintained in a manner that maintains the confidentiality of the information and protects the privacy of the resident.

- 1. Compliance with all applicable legislation, including but not limited to HSCA, PHIA, and PIPEDA.
- 2. Policies and procedures regarding resident records are developed and followed with respect to:
  - a) a multidisciplinary approach to documentation standards and first hand charting;
  - b) access, privacy, confidentiality; and
  - c) privacy breach and security.
- 3. Resident records are protected from unauthorized collection, use, disclosure, copying and modification.

- Upon admission, residents and/or authorized designates are provided with information regarding how residents' health information will be collected and shared within the circle of care.
- 5. Resident records are only disclosed in accordance with the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act* (Nova Scotia), the *Personal Health Information Act* (Nova Scotia), the *Personal Information Protection and Electronic Documents Act* (Canada), the *Homes for Special Care Act* (Nova Scotia), the *Protection for Persons in Care Act* (Nova Scotia) or any other applicable legislation.
- 6. For adult residents, there is a records retention schedule of 5 years minimum post discharge. Destruction of records must be done in a secure manner.
- For residents under 18 years of age, there is a records retention schedule of 5 years minimum after the age of majority is reached. Destruction of records must be done in a secure manner.
- 8. Residents' financial records are maintained in a safe and secure manner, are separate from resident care records and are maintained in accordance with Canada Revenue Agency requirements.

## 11.0 HUMAN RESOURCES MANAGEMENT

## 11.1 Human Resources Practices

### Outcome:

The staff complement supports the achievement of the outcomes in all program areas.

- 1. The following policies and procedures are developed and followed:
  - a) recruitment, hiring and orientation of staff members;
  - b) employee and volunteer involvement in residents' personal affairs including:
    - · acceptance of gifts from residents;
    - involvement in residents' financial affairs, including Enduring Power of Attorney, wills and estates; and
    - involvement in residents' non-financial affairs including personal directives and guardianship.
- 2. Pre-employment Vulnerable Sector Checks are completed for staff members, students and volunteers at the time of hire and are maintained on file.
- 3. A written human resources plan is developed and includes the anticipated human resources required to deliver consistent, quality services.
- The allocation of staff members is appropriate in number and qualifications reflecting the needs of residents and the layout of the home; and government funded direct care hours are utilized as intended.
- 5. There is a current job description for each position which is reviewed a minimum of every four years and clearly defines the role, responsibilities and scope of the position. A copy of the current job description is provided to staff members.
- 6. The home provides a documented, timely orientation for all staff members, volunteers and contracted personnel. The orientation provides the necessary information to support residents in a safe manner and improve their quality of life.
- 7. An orientation checklist, indicating which orientation components have been completed by staff, is signed, dated and maintained in each staff member's personnel file.
- 8. Formalized performance management processes that evaluate staff members' performance annually, and more frequently as necessary, are in place.
- 9. Volunteers are supervised and supported in their roles and do not replace paid staff members.

10. Contracted personnel work under the policies and procedures of the licensee.

# **Additional Requirements for Nursing Homes**

The licensee shall ensure:

11. The home is staffed in accordance with the staffing model as funded by the Department of Health and Wellness.

## **Additional Requirements for Residential Care Facilities**

The licensee shall ensure:

12. The home is staffed in accordance with the allocated funding approved by the Department of Health and Wellness.

## 11.2 Staff Qualifications

## Outcome:

Staff members have an appropriate educational level and related experience to support program outcomes.

The licensee shall ensure:

1. Staff hired after March 31, 2016 in the following key positions meet the following minimum education and experience requirements: NOTE: Some positions may not apply to all homes.

Administrator	A minimum of a Baccalaureate degree in a field of study relevant to the operation of a nursing home and five years of relevant managerial experience.  In nursing homes with less than 30 beds, where there is no Director of Resident Care, the Administrator will be an RN.		
Director of Resident Care	Baccalaureate degree/diploma in nursing and current registration with the College of Registered Nurses of Nova Scotia and three years of relevant health care management experience.		
Assistant Director of Care	Baccalaureate degree/diploma in nursing and current registration with the College of Registered Nurses of Nova Scotia and three years of relevant experience.		
Business Manager	Bachelor of Business Administration or Commerce with concentration in accounting and three years of relevant experience. Equivalent combination of formal education and work experience may be considered.		
Recreation Director	Degree in Recreation Therapy with certification in the field of Therapeutic Recreation from the National Council for Recreation Therapeutic Certification and current membership with either Nova Scotia Recreation Professionals in Health or Therapeutic Recreation Association Atlantic Canada. Equivalent combination of formal education and work experience may be considered.		

Hospitality Manager	Diploma in an applicable field and two years of relevant experience.			
Food Service Manager	Diploma in a food service related field and two years of relevant experience.			
Registered Nurses (RN)	Current registration with the individual provincial licensing body.

Physiotherapist (PT)	Current registration with the individual provincial licensing body.

2. Minimum Education Requirements and Experience – Residential Care Facility

Administrator	A combination of education and experience necessary to	
	achieve the required outcomes.	

- 3. Staff members individually and collectively have the skills and experience to deliver the services and care which the setting offers to provide.
- 4. Verification of current licensure, certification, registration or other relevant credentials of staff members (as applicable). Proof of verification is maintained.

## 11.3 Mandatory Continuing Education

#### Outcome:

Staff and volunteers have the necessary knowledge, skills, and abilities and provide quality care and service.

- 1. Policies and procedures regarding the ongoing education of staff members are developed and followed. This includes mandatory education and training, which meets the specific needs of staff members, and training on the safe use of equipment.
- 2. Ongoing education to meet the needs of the resident population is provided to staff members by qualified individuals.
- 3. Staff members, and volunteers when appropriate, receive initial and on-going training as needed and are knowledgeable about the following:
  - the philosophy of care;
  - the model of care;
  - relevant legislation, requirements, standards, policies; and
  - leading practices.

4. Maintenance of annual attendance records for individual staff participation in education sessions, including the date of the sessions.

### 12.0 PHYSICAL SPACE

### 12.1 Environmental Services

## Outcome:

The well-being of residents, staff, volunteers and visitors is enhanced by the home's homelike physical environment, which is effectively and efficiently cleaned.

- 1. Policies and procedures, including cleaning schedules and routines, are developed and followed to ensure a clean living environment.
- 2. Housekeeping schedules are flexible and are planned to accommodate the residents' routines, while maintaining a clean and safe environment.
- 3. Regularly scheduled environmental services audits are completed to ensure compliance with leading practices for environmental cleaning.
- 4. The following processes are developed and followed:
  - a) accommodating necessary housekeeping duties outside of regular environmental services hours, e.g. spills;
  - b) augmenting environmental cleaning & disinfection schedules during increased activity or outbreaks of infectious diseases; and
  - c) ensuring compliance with Workplace Hazardous Materials Information System (WHMIS) regulations. Current Material Safety Data Sheets for all applicable products used/stored in the home are maintained and are easily accessible to staff members.
- 5. Appropriate mechanisms are in place to effectively minimize unpleasant odours.
- 6. Hazardous products that may be harmful to residents are secured at all times and are not accessible to residents. They are stored and disposed of in accordance with established safety practices/manufacturers' recommendations.
- 7. Cleaning and disinfecting agents are mixed and used according to manufacturers' recommendations.
- 8. Cleaning and disinfectant products and other chemicals used in environmental cleaning are not used after their expiration date.

## 12.2 Condition of Home and Site

### Outcome:

The home and site are maintained through good stewardship and provide a comfortable, secure environment that optimizes resident quality of life and supports the delivery of safe, quality resident accommodation and care.

## 12.2.1 General Requirements:

The licensee shall ensure:

- 1. There is a preventive maintenance program for the home.
- Site development and building alterations or change in use of space from that originally intended have the approval of the Department of Health and Wellness and other required authorities.
- 3. Repairs and alterations to the home are carried out in accordance with applicable CSA standards.
- 4. Decommissioned, redundant equipment and materials are properly removed and disposed.
- 5. Systems, furnishings and equipment are maintained in accordance with the requirements of the manufacturer and/or accepted industry standards, whichever is more stringent.
- 6. Furnishings selected for the home are made of materials that can be easily cleaned and disinfected.
- 7. Furniture for open concept living areas, which may include chairs, tables, other related furnishings and upholstered furniture meets all of the requirements of the Office of the Fire Marshal.
- 8. Root causes analyses of building and maintenance issues related to compromised functionality, including but not limited to, surface integrity and aesthetic integrity are identified, analyzed and corrected.

# **Additional Requirements for Nursing Homes**

The licensee shall ensure:

9. Compliance with the Department of Health and Wellness' Nursing Home Maintenance Standard.

## Additional Requirements for Homes Constructed in 2005 or Later

The licensee shall ensure:

10. Building systems and components perform to originally intended standards for control

of water (including vapour and condensation) and air movement.

# 12.2.2 Site Requirements:

- 1. Developed areas of the site are finished with a mix of soft landscaping (lawns, ground cover, shrubs, trees or planting beds) and hard landscaping (pavement or pavers) and are maintained to a high standard.
- 2. Aesthetic, functional and surface integrity of the following are maintained:
  - a) hard surfaced areas such as, but not limited to, smooth, level walkways;
  - b) building envelope such as, but not limited to, roofs, windows, doors, gutters, coatings and sealants;
  - c) interior building components such as, but not limited to, partitions, ceilings, doors, casework, coatings and sealants;
  - d) exterior equipment, furniture and structures such as, but not limited to, tanks, fences, signage and transformers;
  - e) building systems, furnishings and equipment such as, but not limited to, plumbing, heating, ventilation, power, lighting, emergency power, fire alarm, voice and data in accordance with manufacturers' guidelines and/or requirements; and
  - f) all furnishings, equipment, exposed mechanical and electrical systems and components such as, but not limited to, fixtures, trim, devices, enclosures and fabrics.
- 3. Aesthetic integrity and health of lawn areas and plant materials are maintained.
- 4. Windows are restricted from opening more than 8 inches.
- 5. Exterior doors are free of obstacles such as snow and ice.
- 6. Service and access operational clearances required for maintenance are not compromised.

Hi Reinhard

Apologies for delayed follow up.

The cost is fairly high as compared to thermometers. It seems like the temp monitor system would still need to have staff monitor it, to flag that a staff has a temperature, so can you outline how this will benefit? Do you have a supply issue with thermometers? Just trying to understand justification for the cost. I like to support new ideas however I also have to defend them as being reasonable.

With the large numbers of staff entering our campuses, this seeing with introduce significant efficiencies. Currently we have a number if staff tied up in the screening process. With declining staff numbers, we are needing to redeploy these staff elsewhere. Currently if an individual is identified as having a temp, our process involves further assessment with our Occ Health Team. This process would continue.

With the large numbers of staff entering our campuses, this seeing with introduce significant risk reduction.

This will allow us to better maintain physical distancing during our screening process. It will also prevent queuing that is occurring particularly at Shift change- currently staff maintaining 6 ft. distancing are queuing outside of the building.

This will allow our current thermometers used during screening to be redeployed to care areas as the need gowns in those areas.

We see this investment as something we will maintain in future as part of our infection control procedures.

I know the thermometer covers are been an ordering issues. In another facility they spoke with local Infection control and are putting prove covers in a baggie/container with the resident or staff name on it and cleaning with alcohol in between use (for those not impacted by covid). This would have to be explored by your site with Infection Prevention Control nurse, however I share that to explore.

Yes we have done that for residents- our key issue is screening procedures- currently we are cleaning thermometers after each use with alcohol as indicated

### Other thoughts?

Would this only be used in high peak ILI season? Currently doors are closed to only staff, however do staff enter into a specific door/area in regular times? In regular times(post Covid), if it was mounted then would it capture visitors temperatures as well. Not sure this is privacy issue? I suspect would have to be disclosed at the entrance?

As noted above, we will continue to use these tools/processes in the future to prevent outbreaks- we will all be adapting our infection control protocols based on our learnings from this pandemic.

This approach is not sustainable given that lack of a definitive time frame for the current situation combined with the large volume of staff to be screened during shift changes.



b) Neither the expiration nor the earlier termination of this Agreement shall relieve, or be deemed to relieve, either Party from any duties, obligations and/or liabilities hereunder, which accrued prior to such expiration or termination, or that by their nature are intended to survive the expiration or earlier termination of this Agreement.

## 2) Clinical Operations

- a) The Parties will adhere to best practices for infection prevention and control.
- The Parties will work collaboratively to plan and deliver care to assigned Northwood residents.
- c) The Parties acknowledge that Department of Health and Wellness Long Term Care licensing restrictions, such as monitoring standards or policies, may have to be amended to be able to safely provide acute care within the long term care environment.
- d) Northwood shall notify NSHA in writing immediately in the event that Northwood disputes an activity or decision of NSHA. Any dispute will be jointly resolved by NSHA and Northwood as soon as clinical operations and/or conditions permit.

## 3) Roles and Responsibilities of NSHA

- a) NSHA shall establish an Emergency Operations Centre to support COVID-19 response requirements within Northwood.
- b) Support provided to Northwood by NSHA shall include but not be limited to: providing devices/equipment, delivery of clinical care, and administrative and support services, as needed, to assist Northwood during the local COVID-19 outbreak within the Facility. NSHA services will be provided to augment or support Northwood operations, and will include support directly related to COVID-19, as well as support of Northwood operations unrelated to COVID-19.
- c) NSHA shall have <u>primary</u> responsibility for the delivery of acute care within the Facility by NSHA employees, medical staff, volunteers, agents, and subcontractors ("NSHA Personnel"), including the practices and guidelines for the delivery of acute care by NSHA Personnel. <u>NSHA shall provide additional staffing assistance as required to support the delivery of non-acute care</u>.
- d) NSHA Personnel redeployed to the Facility shall provide services within their respective professional scopes of practice.

b) Northwood may choose to provide some gratuitous benefits (such as accommodations and meals) to NSHA Personnel during this temporary emergency situation. Any such benefits that may be offered by Northwood to any NSHA Personnel are the sole responsibility of Northwood and outside the Ministerial Directive, this Agreement and the GNP and MOA on the Casual Resource Pool dated April 16, 2020 (where applicable).

- d) Northwood agrees to work with DHW Monitoring and EvaluationLicensing and Compliance, as needed, to amend any Department of Health and Wellness Long Term Care licensing restrictions as required pursuant to section 2.

## 5) Medical Information and Records

- a) Northwood is the custodian of and, will remain responsible for the retention, maintenance, security, disclosure, and use of, the medical records and personal health information of Northwood residents unless and until they become a registered patient of NSHA.
- b) NSHA Personnel may review, report on, and make entries in the Northwood medical records as necessary to fulfill their professional obligations, to meet the documentation needs required to maintain the quality of resident care.
- b)c) NSHA Personnel will fulfill their professional obligations as an agent, as defined in the Personal Health Information Act s3(a), to Northwood.

## 6) Confidentiality & Privacy

- a) Northwood and NSHA acknowledge that information about identifiable individuals ("Personal Information" and/or "Personal Health Information," as that term is defined in the Personal Health Information Act (Nova Scotia) ("PHIA")), has or may be shared between the parties, in accordance with PHIA, for the purpose of facilitating collaboration under this Agreement.
- b) NSHA and Northwood may exchange Confidential Information to facilitate collaboration under this Agreement. Except as permitted by this Agreement, with consent, or as required under applicable laws, each Party agrees not to disclose or permit the disclosure of any Confidential Information pertaining to the other Party to a third party, and each Party will use any Confidential Information of the other Party only for the purposes of exercising or performing its rights and duties under this Agreement.
- c) NSHA and Northwood agree that upon request, each will cease all use of any Confidential Information of the other and will return all documents, software or other media containing such Confidential Information upon the termination of this Agreement.

d) For the purposes of this Agreement, "Confidential Information" means any and all information supplied to, or obtained by, a Party (the "non-disclosing party") by, or from, the other Party (the "disclosing party") in the exercise or performance of a right, duty or obligation under this Agreement, and, without the foregoing, includes any information about the disclosing party, its trade-secrets, know-how, processes, formulas, standards, marketing plans, operations, finances, programs, operational procedures, Personal Information and Personal Health Information, proprietary information and other business information, but does not include information that, at the time of disclosure, was in the public domain, or which later enters the public domain through no fault of the non-disclosing party, or information that the non-disclosing party can prove was in its possession at the time of disclosure and was not acquired, directly or indirectly, from the disclosing party.

## 7) Communications

a) The Parties will work together to develop and promote key messages regarding this Agreement. In the event of media requests regarding the work related to this Agreement, the Parties will consult each other prior to responses.

## 8) Liability and Indemnity

- a) Each party shall be responsible for the supervision and control of its officers, directors, employees, agents and representatives and their activities at the Facility. Each party is responsible for any and all actions, claims, liabilities, losses, costs, and expenses, which directly arise from its own operations or activities within the Facility.
- b) In no event shall either party be liable for any indirect or consequential damages that are sustained by the other party.
- c) Northwood shall indemnify and save harmless NSHA, its officers, directors, employees, agents and representatives from and against all damages, actions, suits, claims, demands, or other proceedings of any kind or nature, which they, or any of them, may at any time incur or sustain as a result of or arising out of the actions, omissions, or negligence of Northwood, or their officers, directors, employees, agents and representatives or subcontractors.

## 9) Insurance

- a) Both Parties shall, during the Term of this Agreement, maintain the following insurances with insurers licensed in Nova Scotia:
  - Professional Liability, where applicable, in an amount not less than \$5,000,000, per claim, insuring liability for errors and omissions in the performance of professional services;
  - ii) Comprehensive General Liability in an amount not less than \$10,000,000, per claim, insuring against bodily injury, personal injury, and property damage including loss of use thereof. Such insurance shall include non-owned automobile liability; and
  - iii) Automobile Liability on all vehicles owned, operated or licensed in the name of the Party in an amount of not less than \$2,000,000.

b) Upon request, either party shall provide the other party with acceptable evidence of all required insurance in the form of a Certificate of Insurance.

## 10) Independent Contractor

- a) NSHA and Northwood agree that NSHA is acting as an independent contractor under this Agreement. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed as creating an employer-employee relationship between Northwood and NSHA's Personnel or NSHA and Northwood's Personnel. Neither Party are in any way a common employer with the other Party as referred to in section 21 of the Nova Scotia *Trade Union Act*.
- b) All NSHA employees will remain as employees of NSHA and shall be covered under NSHA's Workers' Compensation coverage. All Northwood employees will remain as employees of Northwood and shall be covered under Northwood's Workers' Compensation coverage.

### 11) Financial Arrangements

- a) NSHA will track all costs (labour and supplies) related to services provided to Northwood. Determination of final allocation of costs incurred will be determined by the Department of Health and Wellness.
- b) As per section 4, Northwood will cover the cost of any benefits that may be offered by Northwood to NSHA Personnel.

a) Any notice to be given under this Agreement by NSHA or the Supplier shall be in writing and delivered by hand, by facsimile transmission or by registered mail, to the other party at the address and to the attention of the contact individual indicated below:

# GOOD NEIGHBOUR PROTOCOL

## GUIDING PRINCIPLES:

The parties to this protocol recognize that many emergencies may exceed the capabilities of a particular jurisdiction, be that jurisdiction within or outside of the Province of Nova Scotia. The parties further recognize that there will be emergencies that require immediate action in order to allow a prompt and effective response. The parties further recognize that participants in an emergency response require certain information and facts to be known and understood in order to permit full attention to the emergency at hand. The purpose of this protocol is to facilitate the sharing of human resources among various jurisdictions in the event of an emergency arising from events such as a pandemic or a natural disaster.

In response to the foregoing, the parties have agreed to the following: agree that in formulating this agreement, the health, safety, and well being of the victims of the emergency and of those responding to assist are funda

# Declaration of a pandemic or emergency event

This does not include a situation arising from a labour dispute. An event will be determined by the Province of Nova Scotia as an emergency or a pandemic event, by a specifically designated and authorized representative of the Province

Employee participation—away from their usual employer

Employees participating in a role outside of the jurisdiction of their usual employer in an "event" recognized and designated as an emergency or pandemic will do so by agreeing to provide their services.

In such a situation the Province will ensure that the empl Such participation is contingent on the employee receiving specific approval from their usual employer loyee's union(s) and the union(s) at the receiving jurisdiction are advised in a timely manner

## Compensation while participating

e will be considered time worked

There will be no financial loss or out-of-pocket expense to a participating employee.

The regular provisions of the usual employment relationship will apply to matters of basic compensation (i.e., pay, benefit accrual and pension, travel and accommodation, etc.).

Matters pertaining to scheduling hours of work and assignment of duties will be determined under the terms and conditions applicable at the host employer, including the compensation provisions of a collective agreement if applicable.

## -Quarantine

A participating employee subsequently required to be isolated under a "required isolation" will have such time considered as at work and will suffer no loss of regular earnings or benefits for the period of the isolation.

## Role and duties

In no case will an employee be required or expected to perform any duties that the employee considers to exceed their scope of expertise, scope of licence or certification Employees will inform or declare to the employer any limitations in the performance of duties. Participating employees may be required to carry out duties and responsibilities not normally considered as core duties and responsibilities falling within the scope of their regular positions

All persons not employed by an employer who subsequently volunteer to participate in the employer's event will be provided with supervision by the employer. Persons considered as volunteers will be deemed to be temporary employees—non compensated and will be directed by the employer.

# Assistance from out of province—ability

Where a public health emergency in Nova Scotia requires the Province to request assistance from another province or territory, health-care and emergency employees from another province or territory may provide services to assist in the health-care emergency in Nova Scotia regardless of a provision in a collective agreement that limits the assignment or work to members of the union.

In such a situation the Province will ensure that the union(s) present at the affected workplace are advised in a timely manr

# Assistance from out of province

Health-care or other emergency workers from another province or territory providing services in Nova Scotia in a public health emergency will continue to be employed by their employer and to receive their wages and benefits from their employer but will provide services under the terms and conditions of employment respecting hours of work, scheduling, and performance of duties that apply under the applicable collective agreements in Nova Scotia.

## Workers' Compensation

Employees participating in a role outside of the jurisdiction of their usual employer under the Good Neighbour Protocol will continue to be covered, through their usual employer, by the provisions of the Workers' Compensation Board of Nova Scotia.

WHEREAS, in response to the provincial state of emergency arising from COVID-19 and pursuant to section 46 of the Nova Scotia *Public Service Act* and section 11 of the Nova Scotia *Health Authorities Act*, the Honourable Randy Delorey, Minister of Health and Wellness in Nova Scotia has issued a Ministerial Directive, dated April 19, 2020, with respect to the redeployment of NSHA staff (the "Minister's Directive");

("Northwood")

AND WHEREAS NSHA may assist the broader healthcare sector outside its jurisdiction through the sharing of human resources in accordance with the principles of the Nova Scotia Good Neighbour Protocol dated October 27, 2009 (the "GNP"), including recruiting and bringing into employment casual resources;

AND WHEREAS, in accordance with the Minister's Directive and GNP, and as part of NSHA's operations and at NSHA's direction, certain NSHA staff are redeployed to Northwood Halifax Campus long-term care facility (the "Facility") to support Northwood in responding to the local COVID-19 outbreak within the Facility;

AND WHEREAS the Parties agree that NSHA will provide support, including clinical, administrative and other support services, to assist Northwood during the local COVID-19 outbreak within the Facility, in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth within this Agreement.

**NOW THEREFORE** in condition of the mutual promises and covenants herein, the Parties agree to the following:

## 1) Term and Termination

 This Agreement shall continue in full force and effect in accordance with the Minister's Directive. b) Neither the expiration nor the earlier termination of this Agreement shall relieve, or be deemed to relieve, either Party from any duties, obligations and/or liabilities hereunder, which accrued prior to such expiration or termination, or that by their nature are intended to survive the expiration or earlier termination of this Agreement.

## 2) Clinical Operations

- a) The Parties will adhere to best practices for infection prevention and control.
- b) The Parties will work collaboratively to plan and deliver care to assigned Northwood residents.
- c) The Parties acknowledge that Department of Health and Wellness Long Term Care licensing restrictions, such as monitoring standards or policies, may have to be amended to be able to safely provide acute care within the long term care environment.
- d) Northwood shall notify NSHA in writing immediately in the event that Northwood disputes an activity or decision of NSHA. Any dispute will be jointly resolved by NSHA and Northwood as soon as clinical operations and/or conditions permit.

## 3) Roles and Responsibilities of NSHA

- a) NSHA shall establish an Emergency Operations Centre to support COVID-19 response requirements within Northwood.
- b) Support provided to Northwood by NSHA shall include but not be limited to: providing devices/equipment, delivery of clinical care, and administrative and support services, as needed, to assist Northwood during the local COVID-19 outbreak within the Facility. NSHA services will be provided to augment or support Northwood operations, and will include support directly related to COVID-19, as well as support of Northwood operations unrelated to COVID-19, including providing additional staffing assistance, as required, to support the delivery of non-acute care within the Facility.
- c) NSHA shall have primary responsibility for the delivery of acute care within the Facility by NSHA employees, physicians, medical staff, volunteers, agents, and subcontractors ("NSHA Personnel"), including the practices and guidelines for the delivery of acute care by NSHA Personnel.
- d) NSHA Personnel redeployed to the Facility shall provide services within their respective professional scopes of practice.
- e) NSHA Personnel redeployed to the Facility shall be subject to and shall continue to act in accordance with NSHA's standards of clinical care.

## 4) Roles and Responsibilities of Northwood

- a) Northwood is the custodian of and, will remain responsible for the retention, maintenance, security, disclosure, and use of, the medical records and personal health information of Northwood residents unless and until they become a registered patient of NSHA.

- d) For the purposes of this Agreement, "Confidential Information" means any and all information supplied to, or obtained by, a Party (the "non-disclosing party") by, or from, the other Party (the "disclosing party") in the exercise or performance of a right, duty or obligation under this Agreement, and, without the foregoing, includes any information about the disclosing party, its trade-secrets, know-how, processes, formulas, standards, marketing plans, operations, finances, programs, operational procedures, Personal Information and Personal Health Information, proprietary information and other business information, but does not include information that, at the time of disclosure, was in the public domain, or which later enters the public domain through no fault of the non-disclosing party, or information that the non-disclosing party can prove was in its possession at the time of disclosure and was not acquired, directly or indirectly, from the disclosing party.

## 8) Communications

a) The Parties will work together to develop and promote key messages regarding this Agreement. In the event of media requests regarding the work related to this Agreement, the Parties will consult each other prior to responses.

## 9) Liability and Indemnity

- a) Each party shall be responsible for the supervision and control of its officers, directors, employees, agents and representatives and their activities at the Facility. Each party is responsible for any and all actions, claims, liabilities, losses, costs, and expenses, which directly arise from its own operations or activities within the Facility.
- b) In no event shall either party be liable for any indirect or consequential damages that are sustained by the other party.

c) Northwood shall indemnify and save harmless NSHA, its officers, directors, employees, agents and representatives from and against all damages, actions, suits, claims, demands, or other proceedings of any kind or nature, which they, or any of them, may at any time incur or sustain as a result of or arising out of the actions, omissions, or negligence of Northwood, or their officers, directors, employees, agents and representatives or subcontractors.

## 10) Insurance

- a) Both Parties shall, during the Term of this Agreement, maintain the following insurances with insurers licensed in Nova Scotia:

  - ii) Comprehensive General Liability in an amount not less than \$10,000,000, per claim, insuring against bodily injury, personal injury, and property damage including loss of use thereof. Such insurance shall include non-owned automobile liability; and
  - iii) Automobile Liability on all vehicles owned, operated or licensed in the name of the Party in an amount of not less than \$2,000,000.
- b) Upon request, either party shall provide the other party with acceptable evidence of all required insurance in the form of a Certificate of Insurance.

## 11) Independent Contractor

- a) NSHA and Northwood agree that NSHA is acting as an independent contractor under this Agreement. And Whereas there may be a need for the NSHA to assist other Employers by sharing casual resources with the broader healthcare sector to support the safety, health and wellbeing of Nova Scotians during the (state of emergency or Pandemic);

And Whereas the NSHA is positioned to recruit and bring into employment casual resources to support its own needs and to support the needs to the broader healthcare sector outside its jurisdiction in accordance with the principles of the Good Neighbor Protocol ("GNP");

The Parties are agreed to the following in respect of their applicable collective agreements:

- Notwithstanding job posting provisions in the collective agreements applicable to the NSHA, the NSHA may post for employees and hire in an expedited manner for a casual resource pool to provide support as required during the pandemic.
- 2. Job applications for a casual resources pool will be open to external applicants only as the intention is to increase casual resources capabilities.

The zone redeployment centre for the casual resource pool will be treated as the home area of the Casual employees and they will be precluded from placing their names on any Work Area Specific Casual Lists (WASCL) during the pandemic unless permission is granted by the Employer and the applicable Constituent Union. DHW asked if any of our staff had tested positive since working at NW. I checked with Tom and as of noon on Wednesday we had none. I advised DHW

After sharing that with them we later learned of one case testing positive post working at NW. DHW was informed on Thursday morning call.

As Joanne mentioned, on the same call IWK stated they were concerned with timing of our release and that they didn't agree/felt it was inconsistent.

Our message was released Friday night after extensive conversations with Dr Bourke.

Janet H contacted me yesterday to get copies of our documents and stated that she/they understood that Dr S had said on a call on weekend of ministerial directive that there was to be 14 day isolation. I advised her we worked with Dr Bourke who was following guidelines.

Alex sent meeting request last evening to meet w me and Ryan E-B to confirm how each of us are doing it.

NSHA is allowing asymptomatic staff to come to work and follow work isolation procedures (checking temp, calling OH etc) and self isolating at home for the 14 day period. It looks like a hybrid or modified version - for those who are asymptomatic.

### **Guidelines for Healthcare Workers Movement between work locations**

- NSHA acute care facilities will follow Infection Prevention and Control Guidelines for Acute Care Facilities (April, 2020).
  - a. HCWs will be cohorted to work only with known COVID-19 patients during a shift.
  - b. HCWs assigned to work in a COVID-19 unit should be dedicated to that unit.
  - c. These principles are applicable should staff work at multiple sites and consideration should be given to cohorting staff to one site or the other for a small block of time, if possible.

This minimizes the risk of cross contamination amongst units. This may change as the situation evolves and will be based on recommendation of IPAC and Employee Health.

- 2. LTC facilities within NSHA will follow the Directive from Chief Medical Officer of Health for LTC facilities (April 17, 2020) and NSHA IPAC Guidelines for Long Term Care (April, 2020).
  - a. Public Health will determine if staff can work between outbreak and nonoutbreak facilities. Consult with NSHA Infection Prevention and Control and Occupational Health and Safety, as required.
  - b. In the event of critical staff shortages, and under the direction of Public Health, staff from non-outbreak facilities may work in outbreak facilities. Staff may continue to work in their home facilities. This exception will not apply to those who have been identified as a close contact by Public Health
  - c. Staff will be cohorted to work with symptomatic or asymptomatic residents during a shift.
  - d. HCWs assigned to work in a COVID-19 unit should be dedicated to that unit.
- 3. IPAC may place further restrictions on staff movement related to an non -Covid outbreak unit

NSHA has otherwise not placed any restrictions on movement of staff within/between NSHA facilities. There has been some impacts to services due to the result of <a href="mailto:some-the">some-the</a> need to isolate employees due to Covid-19, and the need to consider redeployment of work/workers to provide continuous service to some facility functions. If in the event that the need to redeploy staff between sites is required, the aforementioned guidelines and contractual agreements will be followed.



Thanks for getting back to me.

A few additional concerns came up on the last call. The nurses were told they may get Hazard Pay, can the employer also get back to us on this issue?

In addition, these nurses requested to be swabbed after they finish their set of 4/5 rotation or at the end of their shifts for the short/long rotation. They said they will go directly to the Assessment Units after work, as they don't want to expose their families. This will mean they will need additional accommodations waiting for the results.

Some of these nurses also travel with one another and want to ensure they will not be ticketed by HRP. We have suggested they carry their hospital ID with them to avoid this situation, can you confirm that this won't be an issue for these nurses.

The nurses want to know if perhaps the public/press should be informed of the working conditions and the conditions the patients/clients are living in at NW.

I will say that there were experienced nurses on the call and they stated they could never have prepared themselves for the conditions they walked into last night. They could not believe that their employer sent them there without going to evaluate the conditions they were sending their nurses too and the lack of notification they were given prior to starting their shift. The Union notified them on the Nursing FB Group to prepare them and know that they were to contact us with their issues and concerns.

I look forward to hearing from you tomorrow once you consult with Professional Practice and Infection Control after further assessment of the workplace. I look forward to their recommendations and suggestions to ensure the nurses and our other members are protected to care for the clients/patients of NW.

Hi Vickie,

We have had our first call with the nurse from 8.4 that have been redeployed to NW. Below is the list of things needed for NSGEU nurses working at NW. This has been sent by NSGEU to Rollie King, Tracey Unger, Dr. Strang and Caroline Campbell, apparently Dr. Strang does not want to get involved. We have been told that every patient will be treated as if they are Covid positive

Our nurses have addressed additional concerns since they have been redeployed there last night. They want the units set up as if they are at NSHA. There are no trollies outside the rooms with clean PPEs, instead they had boxes of masks in a box on the floor. They had no garbage cans in the room to safely doff their dirty PPEs and dispose of them. They have run out of Purell on the floors. They have no wipes to clean the patients and they have no Viroxx wipes to clean their equipment.

Things are no better there tonight and I understand that the ICN ,manager and the educator were there today, so I am disappointed to say the least that no changes have been made.. I am reaching out to you, as something needs to be done immediately to ensure these nurses are safe and be able to do their job. We have had our Health and Safety Officer on the call and talked about Right to Refuse. We have another call at 1945 tonight.

They need their ward aides there to help them set up the units so that they can work safely and effectively.

Last night they were cleaning probes, that are one time use of a tympanic thermometer in between their patients. They want their paperwork from NSHA for charting purposes as they have not been documenting, and this is a licensing issue.

I hope to hear from you on these issues and they will be addressed ASAP.

### Here is what needs to be in place at NW:

- 1. You need strong nurses in be in Charge. They have their present CN 20.Perso she needs to continue in her role. In addition, another RN there is 20.Perso she needs to be one as well.
- 20. Personal is a casual RN with over 20 years of nursing I believe. I have spoken to her and she is willing to work in a short assignment and also be in a charge role. She will work Monday-Friday or shift work but no nights. So either have her in charge or are use her as the Resource Nurse who can go to the different units and help nurses who have questions or issues and help problem solve,
- 3. These nurses will get things organized, as I don't know how many units there are, but they need to get armbands on the patients so they can identify them, determine who is a CODE and who is not. They have no kardexes with patient information, these are documents that give quick detail about patients and what their needs are for care and deficits and if they require full or partial care. They will schedule proper breaks for the nurses on the day shifts. There should also be a designed nurse charge on each unit for the night shifts, just like their

- unit if working at NSHA.
- 4. These Charge Nurses can look after staffing and ensuring the model of care they require and staff according with the NW workers that are there and keep the flow of care and update families with questions and concerns. This is lacking greatly, family are not being kept informed.
- 5. They need to have an educator on site with them, as well as an Infection Control there on a regular basis until things are set up and staff are NW staff are educated and following NSHA infection control protocols. After that they should be at least on site daily to assist and answer questions. If they are off site they need to be accessible by pager to the staff.
- 6. The staff need to have a contact person on nights in case there are issues and it be on every unit telling them who they are to contact. For instance will this be the Bed Manager at the HI site or the manager on Call with NSHA, contacted through Locating.
- 7. They need our housekeepers on site, as it seems like the place needs a complete overhaul. There needs to be deep cleaning done initially and then cleaning coming through several times a day on each unit and restocking wipes, doing another clean and getting rid of the biohazard wastes of the PPES on a regular basis.
- 8. Does each unit have a ward clerk, if not this is something to consider for a least a clerk for two units, as they will need help.
- 9. They need to have the proper PPEs at all time. I have suggested that they be wearing N95 masks covered with a surgical mask, the surgical can be discarded and they could wear the N95 for the day, as the surgical mask will protect the N95. Then need to ensure they have face shields, as there is lots of coughing going on.
- 10. Each unit needs to have a clean space that they can change into clean PPEs each shift and a dirty space to get out of these clothes. They also need to get cotton scrubs, as they have provided them with polyester and they are too hot to work in and ensure that they are available.
- 11. They also need a designated clean space to chart, and it needs to maintain clean, as this was not being followed. No one is to be in that area with dirty PPEs on.
- 12. The patients that are on the dementia floor need to be kept in their rooms, not running around the unit and touching the PPEs that nursing and other HC workers will be using
- 13. They will need sitters for some of the dementia patients or are they planning on using their CCAs to sit with these patients
- 14. Hotel accommodations, as they don't want to go home to their families
- 15. A list of casuals that are willing to work there, knowing that once they work there, they should not be working back in acute care. It will be too risky for them to come back to acute.





# Approach to Return to Work for Staff Returning from Northwood

#### Situation:

Through the Office of the Chief Medical Officer of Nova Scotia, the Premier has directed that IWK staff returning from deployment to Northwood Halifax Campus long-term care facility undergo a 14-day self-isolation period prior to returning to work at the IWK.

#### **Background:**

The majority of some 219 NSHA staff are also due to return from their Northwood deployment in the next days. With the goal of facilitating their safe reintegration to NSHA worksites, Occupational Health is currently refining the relevant posted guidance, as well as generating information packages for both returning employees and operational managers' use.

#### **Assessment:**

A pro-forma 14-day self-isolation for any/all NSHA staff returning from deployment to Northwood:

- Does not represent a medical accommodation requirement for the vast majority of these
  personnel; following evidence-informed responsible practice, only a very few staff would
  require this level of intervention to support their safety and that of their colleagues/patients.
  Over the past several weeks, some staff have already returned to their home units and on rest
  days have not been following any additional precautions.
- 2. Could trigger staff concerns and confidence regarding the appropriateness or efficacy of their PPE during this or future deployments.
- 3. A 14-day home isolation will have a significant impact on the acute care sector, specifically pertaining to medicine flow. Staff from 8.4 at the Halifax Infirmary would comprise a large proportion of those unable to report to work. Currently 8.4 has a 36 bed capacity for medicine patient, which is currently operating at 20 beds. These beds are staffed with nurses and other professionals from other inpatient services in the QEII. Continued absence of the 8.4 staff and subsequent deployment of staff from other areas to support 20 medicine beds on 8.4 will create a resource barrier in NSHA's ability to increase both surgical and ambulatory care. Other services impacted by the 2 week reduction in available staff include:
  - Central Zone: Neurosciences, other inpatient unit in both Dartmouth and the VG, the emergency department, Primary Care, Nova Scotia Rehabilitation Centre, and Continuing Care.
  - Both Western and Northern zones also continue to support the Northwood effort with 8 staff from each zone currently present in the facility who would require 14 day home isolation
- 4. May trigger heightened expectation(s) around leave entitlement for any future/ongoing deployments.

5.	Approach to return to work from Northwood should be consistent to prevent dispute between staff and unions.

# Recommendation:

- Occupational Health supports the continued application of evidence-guided criteria to determine the fitness for work of staff returning from Northwood or other deployment(s).
- Approach to return to work from Northwood should be consistent.

Please note that there is a direction from MOH to IWK indicating that "At the request of the Premier I am asking that all staff from the IWK who work at Northwood have a 14-day home isolation period before returning to work at the IWK". We are not aware of this specific directive coming to NSHA at this time, however expect that similar will be put in place. I have asked HR to connect with Vicki Sullivan to identify what the operational impact of this directive would be.

Our approved approach through OHS and IPAC is that we are allowing asymptomatic staff to come to work and follow work isolation procedures (checking temp, calling OH etc) and self isolating at home for the 14 day period.

We have had a staff from NZ and WZ test positive after working at Northwood.
