Conditions of Award

Twice yearly, within 90 days following the application deadline, the Nova Scotia Government & General Employees Union is offering bursaries for the following numbers and amounts (at the discretion of the NSGEU Education Committee) to be awarded to members in good standing.

The bursaries will be based on the financial need of the applicant.

One bursary awarded each Spring and Fall shall be designated for a member with a disability. It will be awarded from all eligible applications received where members have self identified as having a disability and scored within the same policy processes as outlined in the Guidelines for NSGEU Bursaries Awarded to NSGEU Members, Policy 2A.8.

This bursary will be announced anonymously within all other bursaries, not identifying the member receiving the award but only stating if the bursary was awarded or not. Should no applications be made for this bursary, it will be awarded with all other bursaries during the regular applications review process.

Applications and all supporting documentation must be filed with the NSGEU on, or prior to, October 15th to be eligible for Fall Bursaries and March 15th to be eligible for Spring Bursaries in each year.

An individual applicant may only ever be awarded one (1) NSGEU Member Bursary.

Signed application by hand or electronic of the applicant and member must appear on Application Form. Missing signatures will cause the application to be invalid and therefore denied.

Note:

If evidence is found that the questions were answered falsely, the application will be considered void. In cases where bursaries have already been awarded, reimbursement will be required from the NSGEU member.

Eligibility

The Applicant must be a Nova Scotia Government & General Employees Union member in good standing for at least 12 months prior to the application.

A clear definition of a member in good standing can be found in the NSGEU Constitution and By-Laws.

Applicants having met the above; who wish to continue their academic education on a full-time basis, therefore resigning from their employment to attend a post-secondary institution will remain eligible.

Requirements

1. Successful applicants who have resigned from their employment will remain eligible only upon proof of attendance on a full-time basis. Failure to do so will result in their disqualification.
2. All questions (blank spaces) on the application form must be completed. The application form must be signed by the applicant (by hand or electronic).
3. A letter, from the Registrar's office that confirms current enrolment, from a recognized university or other institution of higher learning, leading to a degree, diploma or certificate, must be included. A "Letter of Application"/"Letter of Admission"/"Letter of Acceptance" will NOT be valid.
4. All applicants must compose and submit a 500-word essay on the history and importance of the labour movement in Nova Scotia and its impact on the applicant.
5. A copy of the Canada Revenue Agency, most recent Notice of Assessment (within 2 years) to verify all sources of household of income, excluding dependent children, must accompany the application. (T4s, tax returns and paystubs are will NOT be accepted)
6. Successful recipients of bursaries must be prepared to enter into normal Union publicity, (Union Stand, social media or website) that goes with receiving such an award and will not be eligible to receive another NSGEU Member Bursary award.
